 Place: Bradshaw Room

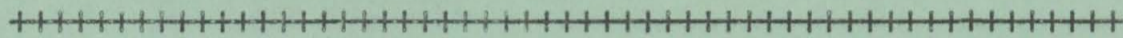
On Sunday Evening: Dr. Andres T. Pumariega will speak on Cuba before the revolution. He was born in Matanzas, Cuba in 1953 and lived there until his family came to the U.S. in 1962. He grew up in the "Little Havana" section of Miami. After receiving his M.D. from the University of Miami, he came to Duke Medical Center, where he is on the house staff in Psychiatry.

On Monday Evening: Rev. William M. Jeffries, pastor of the Mt. Zion United Methodist Church in Garner, N. C., will show slides and discuss Cuba under Castro. (Bill's wife is the former Joanne Lee and a member of Duke Memorial.) Bill served from 1964-1975 as Director of Peace Education for the S.E. Division of the Friends Service Committee. In 1969 he visited Cuba to study the effects of the Revolution on the Cuban people.

On Tuesday Evening: Laney Funderburk will moderate an open discussion between the two speakers and the audience.

Everyone is invited to attend and to learn as much as possible about our near neighbor, whose people live under conditions very different from our own.

The NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC for January 1977 has an excellent article on Cuba. The study text, Cuba: People-Questions, is available in the church library. You are challenged to do your homework and to come with questions and reactions.
