VISITING PREACHER: Sunday, 27 February, our preacher for the morning worship service will be Dr. Raymond Valenzuela, formerly a bishop of the Methodist Church in Chile. Dr. and Mrs. Valenzuela are in part supported by Duke Memorial. They are making their home in Durham during their furlough period. He will speak to us from the perspective of a life spent largely in Chile and will give us something of the feeling of what is happening in the life of the Church there.

ENERGY FUND REPORT: As of the 11th of February, some \$23,000 plus had been given to the Emergency Energy Fund of Durham. Of that, \$17,589 had been disbursed to help over 258 families. This comes to an average of about \$64.00 per family. This represents the help from November through February 11th.

Duke Memorial has now contributed a total of \$941.75 to the Energy Fund.

Also, the wood project helped over 270 families with fuel, and there are over 200 more (non-repeaters) on the waiting list. The Duke University project collected and distributed about 60-76 cords of wood; the BSA project at Pilgrim UCC added another 12-15 cords, and the Salvation Army distributed another 8 - 10 cords which was cut by the Durham Rotary Club.

The need and the response is still very impressive!
