PALMS AND PRAISES

Since my earliest years, I have associated Palm Sunday and praise to God. During the time of preparation for missionary service in Central Africa, aware that there are a number of kinds of palm trees there, I thought that Palm Sunday there ought to be a great festival.

Time passed and we were appointed to Tunda (If you have never heard of Tunda, please do not feel underprivileged; most folks haven't). The path to the station church was lined on both sides with palm trees. Other palm trees were in abundance all over the area. As the week prior to Palm Sunday passed, I could see no evidence of any intent to use these available resources in any sort of pageantry in worship. I talked with the station pastor, discovering that not only was no emphasis given there to Palm Sunday but also that Holy Week was just like any other in the life of the church.

With some urging on my part, Palm Sunday was so recognized. We had some special services for Holy Week, including even an observance of Holy Communion in the evening of Maundy Thursday. Later I found that even Easter Sunday was not customarily a special religious day though Easter Monday was a legal holiday. Some African church leaders responded to my questions with the assertion that "we celebrate the resurrection every day in the year." Why, then, get stirred up about a special day?

Since those days, I've often pondered the whole nature of this season in the Christian year. Learning is part of every experience. What comes to me out of these reflections on church life in Africa is this: do we here in the states have special celebrations because we do believe in fact that Christ is raised from the dead, or do we have such celebrations in an endeavour to believe? What is it to you?

Whichever the reason, it is well worth the effort. Let us then on Palm Sunday join in praise and thanksgiving to God. Let the days of Holy Week be just that for each one of us. May God's Spirit work in us so that on Easter morning, we shall be convinced in saving strength, that God has raised Christ from the dead and that by faith, we are raised with Him.
