ASCENSION DAY

Each time that we say the words of the Apostles' Creed, we affirm that we do indeed believe that Jesus "ascended into heaven." There, continues this statement of faith, "He sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead." Whether we are aware of it or not, in these words we are confessing our confidence in Jesus as King, Priest, and as Prophet. It is for reasons like these that much of Christendom makes a great deal more of Ascension Day than we ourselves usually do.

Ascension is the fortieth day after Easter; thus this year it falls on 19 May. When we notice it at all, it is on the first Sunday after the Ascension of our Lord. It is a kind of bridge from the Sundays after Easter to the great festival of Pentecost which this year is 29 May.

The New Testament record as to the Resurrection of Jesus, His Ascension, and the gift of the Holy Spirit is not entirely consistent. What is significant is that the three events are regarded as of great importance. The differences which exist in the Scriptural accounts are differences of recollection and interpretation, not differences of evaluation.

The church calendar tends to follow St. Luke's version of these events, perhaps because he is the only evangelist who proceeds to the life and work of the early church. Ascension day emphasizes, as A. M. Ramsey put it a long time ago, that Jesus came to share in the sovereignty of God over heaven and earth. Since these powers were in a measure laid aside for a time as Jesus came to earth and fulfilled that to which God called Him, the time when the church celebrates the reaffirmation of His heavenly role and place ought to command our interest. That is what Ascension day is all about. You can find out for yourself by reading the last chapters of St. Luke's Gospel and the first chapters of Acts. That might be the best celebration we could find, anyway. Do it as preparation for Sunday, 22 May, the Sunday after the Ascension!
