PURELY PERSONAL AND SORT OF BOASTFUL: The Associated Press service of the Durham Morning Herald in the Wednesday, 7 September edition, p. 11-C, reported that a Methodist pastor in Minnesota had given birth to a son. The Reverend Katherine Sampson Horn, pastor of Asbury and Holman UMCs in St. Paul, gave birth on Friday, 2 September, to a son, Michael Gordon. All of us will rejoice with Mrs. Horn and her husband, James, a design engineer, in the safe arrival of their baby. This is reported as a "first" for the Minnesota Conference.

With a bow to history and in confidence that the mid-west will not outdo the eastern segment of Methodism, I remind church historians that the Baltimore Conference has preceded Minnesota in this distinction. The pastor of Dorsey Emmanuel UMC, Baltimore, Helen Stiner Smith, on 11 May gave birth to a son, Christopher David, who weighed at birth a pound more than did Michael Gordon and who was born nearly four months before him.
