YOU ARE INVITED!!

Every one in the Duke Memorial Church family is invited for luncheon next Sunday, 20 November, following the morning worship service. This is a Church Family Fellowship meal as part of our Thanksgiving season. The Commission on Missions is the sponsoring group; the "taste test" resulted in the day's menu. Your meal will be good to your taste; it will satisfy your hunger; it will be good for your body; it will be a demonstration step toward a simpler life style; and it will cost the enormous price of fifty cents per person. This is <u>not</u> a "starvation" meal. Members of the Commission believe that all of our family will be astonished at what can be done in simpler living and in food conservation.

In this time of global food shortage (despite temporary overproduction in the United States), is it not appropriate that we learn what we should and should not eat, in order to make food resources available for hungry people - and improve our own health in the process? Primarily because of consumption of grain-fed meat, the average North American uses five times as much grain yearly as a fortunate person living in an area of the world designated as "poor". The unfortunate there simply starve.

The children of our church have been studying world hunger. Some of their hand work will be on display at the luncheon. Also there will be recipes for other satisfying 50¢ meals as well as the <u>More with Less Cookbook</u>. This book is a mine of information about simple, healthier living. Many of these meals are also less demanding on the one doing the cooking than some of our present practices!

Two brief presentations (ten minutes or less) will be made as part of the meal. One dealing with poverty and hunger right here in Durham, is to be given by Mrs. Betty Kelly of the Durham County Department of Social Services. The other, about the happy and beneficial outcome of a simpler life style in terms of nutrition and food consumption, will be given by Barbara Metzler of our own congregation. Barbara is responsible for food production and preparation on the Duke West Campus.

You are invited! This is timely, challenging, and a blessedly wonderful way to open our Thanksgiving celebration. Please join us. Tickets will be on sale 13 November following the morning service, from the church office and in adult classes.
