The goal for aid to them is rather a small one when one considers what needs to be done. It is a goal which challenges each one of us. For years we have given to (or neglected) a Christmas offering which provided help in many needy situations but never really caught the enthusiasm of the churches of our district. Now, we have a situation of real opportunity and the means to respond.

Our budget provides a tiny token (exactly \$20.00) to insure that we never completely omit this concern. Your voluntary gifts added to this budget item will represent our concern for two needy congregations of black Methodists in the Durham district. Checks or envelopes can simply be marked "special" and your gifts will go to this cause. Let this be part of your Christmas giving. All of us will rejoice because of it.
