THANK YOU, LOUISE!

Recently, Louise Crumpacker gave to Duke Memorial three booklets of almost priceless value. One is a 1946 sixtieth anniversary Church Directory, issued for Founder's Week in 1946. Some other members of our congregation undoubtedly have copies of this book. It is a complete listing of the church membership, officers and leaders of all church organizations. There is even a directory of names of those whose addresses are unknown — I suspect we still have some of these names on our rolls, thirty—two years later! There is a classified directory which, under business and professional headings, lists those of the congregation engaged in the several activities that help make up our community. Though this is not an "advertisement" in the usual sense of the word, one concludes that it helped to pay for the publication of the booklet.

At least as interesting to me as the historical value of this book is the fact that a great number of the names listed therein are those of persons or families still active in the life of Duke Memorial. Obviously, some have gone on to glory; we are the richer for their lives. Other family members remain here and the sense of continuity in the life of a great congregation is given a great boost by such a publication.

As a member of this Annual Conference, I am personally and particularly interested in those who have preceded me as pastor at Duke Memorial. In varying degrees of acquaintance or friendship, I know or knew them all, back to the time Dr. H. E. Myers came here in 1923. I enjoy the mild confusion of the statement that I am the fourth person named Smith to be appointed Duke Memorial's pastor, but only the third Smith to serve here!

If you are a long time resident of Durham, spend a little while in looking in attics (when the weather is cooler) and closets. Who knows what treasures you may find that will help us learn more of our past - in order that we better chart our future. The other two books Louise gave us - and in the name of the Church and our Committee on Archives and History we thank her heartily for all three - are the Conference Journals for the years 1873 and 1880. You will hear more about them in another issue of the Messenger.
