Therefore, if you have never had occasion to need this service, you may know nothing of it. We support it with some money for the operating expenses.

Statistics do not always tell the story. The monthly summary furnished to each supporting church simply gives a table listing the categories of calls received and the number of calls in each area. The poem here given was in a letter, unsigned, to CONTACT, Oklahoma City. The letter was dated 12 July 1979.
