MEALS ON WHEELS AND YOU!

What is Meals on Wheels? This program is designed to serve one hot, nutritious home-delivered noon meal to local residents who for health reasons are unable to provide adequate food for themselves. The homebound, convalescing, blind, disabled, and elderly are served. Recipients pay for their meals according to their means, some the full price of \$2.25, some \$1.00, some 25¢.

<u>How does it work?</u> Meals are delivered by volunteers working in teams of two persons. All the food is delivered in insulated carrying-cases and the individual trays are light-weight plastic. Routes are planned to take only one hour of the volunteer's time from start to finish. If volunteers choose not to drive or help deliver, they may help in the Trinity Methodist church kitchen packing trays and preparing the vegetables. The work is light and the program very efficiently organized. Most trips take less than an hour. One can volunteer for an hour a month, an hour a week as a regular worker or as a substitute. Our church urges you to volunteer for this worthy outreach program. The work is immeasureably rewarding. Try it just once! You'll like it.
