BY WAY OF INTRODUCTION

Jane L. Lynch, our organist and choir director, has been with us three months. Born in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, she was reared in Charlotte, N. C. Music has been "her thing". She began piano study at age six and at age thirteen she became assistant organist at Christ Episcopal Church in Charlotte and has never been far from a console since that time.

She is a 1967 graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory with a major in organ which was followed by a Master of Music degree from Northwestern University, Chicago, in 1969. In terms of church music she is "Miss Ecumenicity" herself, having been organist in Episcopal Methodist and Presbyterian churches and having also served for three years as organist in Temple Beth El in Charlotte. As well, she has served as substitute organist in Lutheran, Catholic and Baptist churches.

She taught piano four years in Queens college, Charlotte. In 1976 she came to Durham to become Associate Chapel Organist in Duke Chapel. During this period, she was for one semester director of the Duke Chorale. She teaches organ and piano privately, gives recitals on organ and harpsichord and accompanies violin and voice students.

By way of hobbies, she swims, sews, likes to bake and cook in the Chinese cuisine.

She has been a functioning member of our church staff from her first day here and continues the tradition of excellence in music that is part of this congregation's history. We welcome her, both in personal terms as well as in her professional capacities, and invite members of the congregation to introduce themselves. Go into the choir loft just any Sunday following the morning service - you will be glad you did!
