Margaret Anne Biddle will be a member of the Division on Education and in addition is in the pool of persons elected by the Conference as possible members of jurisdictional boards and agencies.

Ran Few has the rose with perhaps the stickiest thorns - a member of the Council on Finance and Administration, he has been elected chairman of that group. This is the major agency of the Conference in matters of money, costs, appropriations, apportionments and like matters. Mildred Teer is a member of the Division of Higher Education, the group responsible for oversight and correlation of our institutions of higher learning.

Mary Whanger was elected as a member of the Conference Division of Missions, a group with considerable power both in planning and in finance. "Missions" is understood in a very broad sense in the undertakings of this Division. I was elected for another quadrennium as a member of the Board of Pensions, at a time when our Annual Conference pensions crusade, our effort to underwrite unfunded liability for service years, and the actions of the General Conference on pension legislation will make some formidable tasks in the coming quadrennium. Technically I am not a member of Duke Memorial but there is a tie sufficient to feel myself part of the church!

Rejoice with me that in our congregation is found such a number of people for vital jobs that have meaning for us all. Rejoice further that all of them are endowed by God with the abilities to undertake the job and are themselves willing to serve. If the caliber of others on these boards and agencies comes anywhere near that of Duke Memorial's folks, we will, in God's Providence, have a great time.
