Responding to pleas for help in training teachers, the District COM brought back a tried and true format from the past. It enjoyed immediate success, with over 200 persons from the District participating that first year, and with attendance sustaining at that high level each succeeding year.

A significant feature of the Durham CWS is that courses of general interest to all adults are offered in addition to the courses designed specifically for teachers, so anyone may attend.
