#### ADVENT

Those who are fond of apocalyptic often read the terrifying passages in the Revelation of St. John and dwell at length on the fires; the mystical symbols and the esoteric framework of the letter. It is easy for them to forget that immediately after all this comes "a new heaven and a new earth". The end brings the beginning. When a king dies, public announcement is, "The king is dead, long live the king", meaning, among other things, that the successor king is always in line. Once again, the end incorporates a beginning.

As this year's calendar reads, the last Sunday in Kingdomtide is 23 November. The First Sunday in Advent comes on 30 November. The inevitability of an end to one year, be it a civil, solar, personal, liturgical year or whatever kind, ought to remind us of the gracious promise of God that another begins. So, let us view the coming of Advent as the beginning of another year which it is - and let us think of it as a time of renewal and spiritual refreshment.

Advent is a call to history, to be sure. It is also a call to a forward look. The golden age of Christianity is ever in the future, the full coming of the Kingdom of God. The opening years of Christianity came soon after the turn of the era as we date things. With thanksgiving to God, we look backward in history to the time Jesus was among men and as one of us, even though at the same time He was far more than any of us ever will be. A new age was ushered in - but it has yet to be realized in its fulness. Advent therefore has also a forward look. But one may ask, how far in the future is the coming of the King-dom? Jesus warned against idle speculation about that!

What about Advent today - next Sunday? This is the Advent which is ours to live, to experience, to find new strength of spirit, purpose and direction in life. Lighting the candles of the wreath ought to be one way we re-light the faith that is in us. All else that is part of our celebration is done not merely for the sake of tradition, but far more to the point, to enable us in our time to be good witnesses of the life in faith in Christ, and in that faith, to be good stewards of the mysteries of the Gospel.

All that an much more is wrapped up in Advent 1980. Share in the life of this congregation on these Sundays and be blessed as you bless others.
