# A CHRISTMAS MESSAGE FOR ALL OF US --

Henry van Dyke's words on keeping Christmas need a review now and then by all of us. They are chosen as the Christmas wish expression of your church staff for our whole church family. This is his wish:

"Are you willing to forget what you have done for other people and to remember what other people have done for you; to ignore that the world owes you and to think what you owe the world; to put your rights in the background, and your duties in the middle distance, and your chances to do a little more than your duty in the foreground;. . .to close your book of complaints against the management of the universe and look around you for a place where you can sow a few seeds of happiness -- are you willing to do these things even for a day? Then you can keep Christmas.

"Are you willing to stoop down and consider the needs and the desires of little children; to remember the weakness and loneliness of people who are growing old;. . .to bear in mind the things that other people have to bear in their hearts; to try to understand what those who live in the same house with you really want without waiting for them to tell you; to trim your lamp so that it will give more light and less smoke; and to carry it in front so that your shadow will fall behind you; to make a grave for your ugly thoughts and a garden for your kindly feelings, with the gate open, -- are you willing to do these things even for a day? Then you can keep Christmas.

"Are you willing to believe that love is the strongest thing in the world -- stronger than hate, stronger than evil, stronger than death -- and that the blessed Life which began in Bethlehem nineteen hundred years ago is the image and brightness of the Eternal Love? Then you can keep Christmas.

"And if you can keep it a day, why not always? But you can never keep it alone. . ."

van Dyke's words come near to saying it all. We are grateful to God for the privilege of serving as members of Duke Memorial's staff. May God grant you in this season the joy, the peace, love, hope, faith and assurance of His mercy that will bless you these days and always.
