

LABOR RELATIONS

The Gospels give us a word on nearly every human situation. Some of these words seem to be at variance with others. Persons advocating positions diametrically opposed may claim inspiration from the same writings of the New Testament. The parable of the workers in the vineyard, St. Matthew 20:1-16, which is the Gospel for Septuagesima Sunday, 15 February, is one of the more outstanding New Testament teachings which seems hard to reconcile with other general principles laid down by our Lord.

Literalism in Scripture reading can give us a distorted view of what Jesus was saying. Failure to recognize to whom He spoke His parables and other teachings can set us off course. But if we turn to the other extreme and seek to "interpret" His every word, we often wind up putting our words, ideas, thoughts (and sometimes desires) on His lips.

As I have pondered the "hard" sayings of Jesus for a long time, it has come to me that the safest way to find our path in them is to read the Gospels continually, lovingly, searchingly and always prayerfully. This is not a counsel to suggest that in mock piety we set aside the questions that come to our minds. It is rather to say that we need to wrestle with the Word (and not as St. Peter says, II Peter 3:16 "wrest as they do the other Scriptures unto their own destruction"). This means that we take most seriously the proposition that God does speak to us through the Scriptures; that the study of them demands the best that is in us; and that if we fail to do this, we shall be the losers, certainly in this world and quite probably in the world to come.

The story of the men who worked different periods in the vineyard is worthy of your time, study and preparation as it is of mine. Jesus is saying something we need to hear and which possibly some of us don't want to hear. It has to do with much more than labor relations—can you determine what it is? Prepare yourself and let's get together Sunday and see where He leads us!
