

Leader: I appeal to you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to offer yourselves as a living sacrifice to God, dedicated to His service and pleasing to Him.

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People: Do not be conformed to this world but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.

- L: For by the grace given to me I bid every one among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith which God has assigned him.
- P: We have many parts in the one body, and all these parts have different functions. In the same way, though we are many, we are one body in unison with Christ, and we are all joined to each other as different parts of one body.
- L: So we are to use our different gifts in accordance with the grace that God has given us. If our gift is to speak God's message, we should do it according to the faith that we have; if it is to serve, we should serve; if it is to teach, we should teach; if it is to encourage others, we should do so. Whoever shares with others should do it generously; whoever has authority should work hard; whoever shows kindness to others should do it cheerfully.
- P: Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.
- L: When I was a child, I spoke like a child; I thought like a child; I reasoned like a child.
- P: But when I became an adult, I we up my childish ways.
- L: Live in harmony with one anoth do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; never be conceited.
- P: Repay no one evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all.
- L: Beloeved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay, says the Lord."
- P: No, "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him drink, for by so doing you will heap burning coals upon his head." Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
- L: Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful. Love is not arrogant or rude and does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful.
- All: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. Love does no wrong to a neighbor. Live in complete harmony toward the other. And then all of us can praise the Lord together with one voice, giving glory to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
