### ON CELEBRATING OUR HERITAGE:

Two weeks ago I was in Cabarrus County visiting family. I was able to get my father-in-law to go with me to St. John's Lutheran Church near Mt. Pleasant to visit the cemetery. St. John's is the Faggart's home church. In the grave yard lies generation after generation of Faggarts. Jacob Feged arrived in America in 1753 with a group of German Huguenots from the Black Forest region of Germany. His tombstone is in the cemetery. I found the old Tombstone and carefully copied the words from both sides. They were written in German. I brought them back to Durham and called the Leland Phelps for help in translating them. Even though the words were those one reads on a Tombstone time and time again, these words had a special meaning for me. They were part of my heritage.

In these days the membership of Duke Memorial is celebrating its heritage. Some of our families trace membership back to the Chartering Sunday in October of 1886. Others of us have joined since. Yet, all of us have a feeling that we are part of something important and great. To symbolically revisit events of the past has special meaning for us.

On April 4, 1986 we will visit Durham of the 1800s. We will see it via copied photographs made into slides, and through the eyes of Mrs. Mary Semans. We will enjoy a banquet meal, and each other. However, just the feeling of being a part of a small journey into our past will be enough to make most of us want to attend.

On Sunday, April 13, 1986 we will honor persons who have been members of Duke Memorial for fifty years or more. These are the people who made Duke Memorial one of the great churches of Southeastern Methodism. If it is possible to fill the sanctuary of our church with people we ought to be able to do it on this Sunday. Plan now to bring your family. Children need to be a part of this event. They will tell their children about it in years to come.

The First and Second Sundays in May we will celebrate our beginnings with our Episcopal Leaders present. . . Dr. Wallace Kirby and Bishop C.P. Minnick, Jr. Dr. Kirby will preach on the first Sunday. Bishop Minnick will preach on the second Sunday. We are inviting United Methodist Churches who share our history to send representatives on these Sundays. The second Sunday we will have a picnic lunch served on the grounds.

Christians do not join preachers. We do join churches. Duke Memorial Church is your church. It is and will be what you are willing to make it. Join your fellow members as we all celebrate together a time of our past which gives meaning to our present.
