Conference Summer School. . . what is it and why is it? The North Carolina Conference offers a unique experience in a composite school which includes not only the three studies sponsored by the United Methodist Women but other study courses sponsored by other conference boards as well.

You may attend one of two sessions at Methodist College in Fayetteville: the weekend session from Friday afternoon, August 1, through Sunday noon, August 3, or the week session from Sunday afternoon, August 3, through Wednesday noon, August 6.

Quality instructors include Dr. Bernice Johnson, a professor at NCCU teaching Crossroads in Southern Asia (India, SriLanka, Nepal, Pakistan, and Bangladesh); Dr. Paul Mickey of the Duke Divinity School teaching Counseling with Those in Crisis; and Ernie Wendel, Durham District Lay Leader, teaching A Spiritual Journey for Men.

Other courses include Suffering and the Christian Community of Faith, a timely and pertinent Technology in Tension with Human Values; Peace and Justice; Lay Evangelism Visitation; Genesis; Christian Parenting; UMW Basic Course; and a Marriage Enrichment Experience.

The school provides two open forums on Values and Technology and Peace and Justice to discuss current problems and issues. On Wednesday Ed Hammond brings together the themes of the school and discusses how they might influence the future. Conference Summer School offers fun, fellowship, drama, and music. Dormitory rooms are provided at Methodist College.
