We are extremely happy to welcome
REV. and MRS. JOHN WILLIAM (BILL and NANCY) GARRISON,

who have served as United Methodist Missionaries for 32 years in Brazil, for an extended visit at Duke Memorial. Born in Raleigh, N.C., Rev. Garrison earned his Master of Divinity degree at Duke University. Before becoming a missionary, he was a pastor in Kentucky, Indiana, and North Carolina. He began his missionary work in 1955 in the industrial city of Mogi das Cruzes. He later pastored churches in Franca, Sao Paulo, and Campinas, Sao Paulo, where he worked in the Audio-visual Center. He has also served as District Superintendent of Brasilia. Since 1973, Rev. Garrison has served as pastor of the South Wing United Methodist Church in Brasilia, Federal District. During the past year, he has also been minister for the Guara House Church and the English-speaking Union Church. He is grateful to the members of these three churches who allow him to use his creative talents as a graphic artist for the Brazilian United Methodist Church and the Brazilian Bible Society.

Mrs. Garrison, born and raised in Kentucky, received her B.A. degree from Asbury College in Kentucky. In Brazil, she has been actively involved in the women's programs of the church, most recently serving as secretary of the United Methodist Women of the Federal District and as vice-president of the local church's women's group. She has also participated in an ecumenical Bible Study for the wives of Brazilian Senators and Congressmen.

Rev. and Mrs. Garrison have a 12-year-old adopted Brazilian daughter , four grown children (Nanette, Jane, John, and Marcia), and eight grandchildren.
