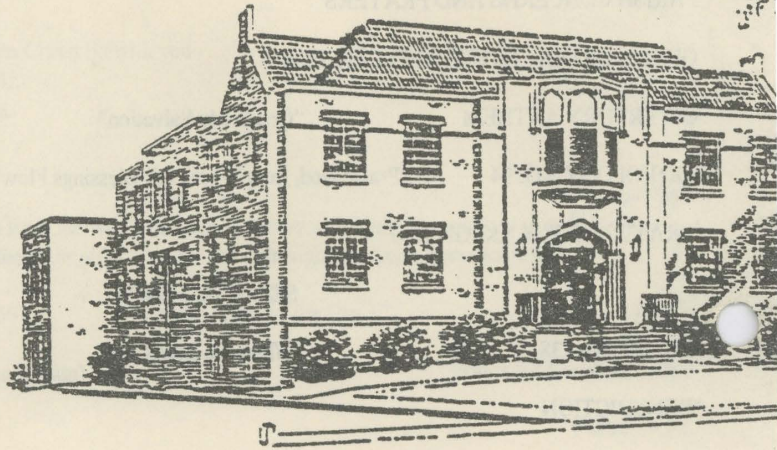

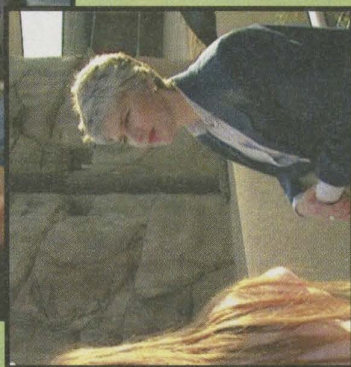
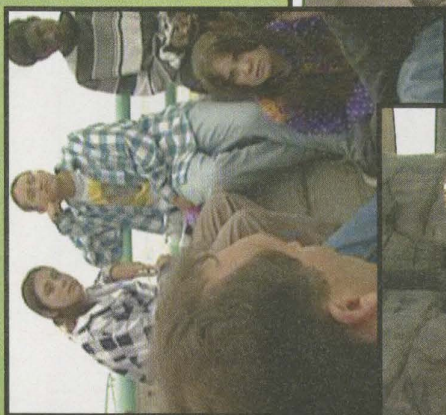

He is only twenty-one, but Javier can already see the difference between his teens and what it is like growing up today. Violence, broken families, gangs, fewer role models, cutbacks in funding, indifferent school officials and overworked social service agencies make this a tough world for young people. The headlines scream about case after case of destructive behavior involving young people. Basically, Javier says, kids aren't bad, they just yearn for role models who can help them find their way.

Javier doesn't simply wring his hands or criticize today's youth. Instead, he is actively engaged as a leader in his community. A student at San Diego State University, he works with high school students, encouraging them to pursue their education. But he wanted to do even more. He responded to an ad in the local paper placed by PARTNERS, a mentoring program for first-time juvenile offenders. PARTNERS is sponsored by seven United Methodist churches in San Diego, Calif., and supported in part by the Human Relations Day offering.

Javier was one of the first assigned a young offender. He immediately set to work to be a role model for this Latino youth. "It is important for young people to see role models that are like them." He works with his assigned youth around issues like staying in school and planning for the future. "Ten years from now, I hope I can meet him on the street and talk about his career instead of just day to day things."

Like young people anywhere, the teens in the PARTNERS Program are often just one incident away from getting involved with the law. Your gift to the Human Relations Day offering helps fund PARTNERS and other programs that work with juvenile offenders, pointing young people in positive directions and towards becoming productive adults.
