A FAMILY NIGHT TO PREPARE FOR CHRISTMAS

An extra special Family Night program is now being planned for next Sunday night, December 6. This will not be an ordinary occasion! WTVD READING PROGRAM

Have you heard about the WTVD Reading Program? This is a program designed to teach adult non-readers and writers, and to help others to improve these skills. Beginning early in January, a series of 98 lessons will be televised into centrally located classrooms, where groups of 10 to 15 students will meet with volunteer teachers who will provide additional help before and after the filmed lessons. The course will be taught from 6 15 a.m. to 7:15 a.m. four mornings each week, and if the demand is great enough also from 5:45 a.m. to 6:45 a.m. for those whose workday begins at 7:00 o'clock.

The program is being coordinated by the Radio-TV Committee of the Durham Junior League in cooperation with the Durham Morning Herald and the Durham Sun and Station WTVD. The goal is at least one teacher and/or substitute teacher from every congregation. A further goal is to have each member assume the personal responsibility of enrolling one student in this course. The value of this course to the student is immeasurable, and means a great deal to the economic and civic improvement of our community as well. Here is a real opportunity for Christian Service.
