MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Since arriving at Duke Memorial the preponderance of theological and practical conversation has centered around one topic: "How to Administer the Lord's Supper." Without delving too deeply into the Protestant Reformation and the debates among Luther, Zwingli, and Calvin, suffice it to say that differing opinions regarding Communion is nothing new. When Jesus said, "Do this in remembrance of me," I wonder if he ever imagined the controversy this symbolic act would create.

I grew up knowing the church to be where "The Word is properly preached and the sacraments rightly administered." That word "rightly" is what divides us.

Questions abound: Should we stand or kneel; sit in the pew or come forward; receive the bread from another's hand or take the bread with our own hands? Should we dip in a common cup or drink from our own individual cup? Should we use wafers, bread cubes, a common loaf or unleavened pita bread? (It doesn't leave crumbs in the juice!) Should we communion weekly, monthly or quarterly?

My aim is not to make everyone happy so much as it is to open the communion table to all who wish to receive Christ. With this purpose in mind here are some of the changes I wish to implement beginning this Sunday and continuing quarterly.

1. Worship Service - We will use the former Methodist and Evangelical United Brethren Service which begins, "Ye that do truly and earnestly repent of your sins..."

2. Kneeling - Those who are able will be invited to kneel at the communion rail and be dismissed by tables.

3. Communion Cup - Each time we receive communion you will be given the option of taking an individual cup or dipping the bread into the common cup. (Parents please instruct your children regarding these choices). While I think the symbolism of the common cup is beautiful, I am troubled by the negative perceptions some have about what they are receiving. The Body and Blood of Christ is meant to be a means of grace.

Please, let us respect one anothers' experiences. There is not just one way to "rightly" administer the sacraments so long as we act in the spirit and presence of Christ.


WATERCOLOR EXHIBIT BY ONE OF OUR OWN
