The Bishop read a paper before the Conference concerning the position of our Church on prohibition and temperance which was endorsed by a rising vote of the Conference. The vote was unanimous, and the paper was ordered printed in the minutes. (See Appendix).

Report of Board of Church Extension:

E. F. Lee read the report one of the Board of Church Extension. It was moved that the report be amended by substituting for the amount asked for in same, the amount received by the Board last year.

The time for adjournment having arrived, on motion, this matter was made special order for tomorrow just after the reading of the minutes.

Announcements were made and the Conference adjourned with the benediction.

THIRD DAY

Friday, November 2, 1928.

The Conference convened at 9:00 A. M., Bishop Mouzon in the chair. Devotional exercises were conducted by Dr. G. T. Rowe.

Special Order:

The time for the special order having arrived, N. H. D. Wilson withdrew his amendment of yesterday and moved that the report, except that part referring to assessment, be adopted and that part be referred without recommendation to the Budget Committee, and it was so ordered.

Following motion was adopted:

That the Conference request the Budget Commission to make no increase in the total assessment for Conference causes but that if any Board shall ask an amount less than the amount assessed for it last Conference, or if the Commission on Budget can recommend further economy that the Budget Commission be requested to divide this amount between the Board of Missions and the Board of Church Extension in the same ratio as their assessments for the present year, increasing the assessment for these Boards by these amounts.

Board of Lay Activities:

F. S. Aldridge read reports No. 1 and 2 of the Board of Lay Activities, and they were adopted. (See Appendix).

Dr. J. E. Crawford, representing the Board of Lay Activities, addressed the Conference.

Report of Duke Commission:

Lee to represent the Board of Church Extension on the Commission and J. M. Ormond to represent the Board of Missions on the Commission, was adopted, and the report as a whole was filed for publication in the Journal.

Resolutions:

We recommend the appointment of L. L. Gobbel as Publicity Director for this Conference for the Conference on religious education to be held at Lake Junaluska in July, 1929.

Conference Entertainment:

J. M. Daniel read the report of the Committee on Conference Entertainment, and it was adopted. (See Appendix).

Afternoon Session:

On motion, the Conference voted to meet at 3:00 P. M. when it adjourns at 1:00 o'clock today.

Louisburg College:

C. K. Proctor offered resolutions concerning the selling of certain property belonging to Louisburg College, and they were adopted. (See Appendix).

Report of Sunday School Board:

H. E. Spence read the report of the Sunday School Board, and it was adopted. (See Appendix).

Leave of Absence:

N. H. D. Wilson was granted leave of absence to return home to attend a funeral.

Board of Missions:

F. S. Love read report No. 1 of the Board of Missions, to which Dr. E. H. Rawlings spoke, after which the report was adopted. (See Appendix).

Introduction:

B. A. Whitmore, one of our Publishing Agents, was introduced to the Conference, and made remarks concerning the business.

Resolutions:

Whereas, Brother Richard Wright has put the State of North Carolina, and especially the Methodist Church in the State, under undying obligation to him by the munificent gift of \$330,000 already contributed and the \$100,000 conditionally subscribed to Louisburg College on its \$500,000 Advancement Program, and whereas, Brother Wright is at this time ill in a hospital in Roanoke.

Therefore, be it resolved that the Secretary of the Conference be instructed to convey by telegraph to Brother Wright the sincere gratitude of this body for his liberal gifts to Christian Education and the assurance of its members that their sincere desire and earnest prayer is that he may be restored to health speedily.

APPENDIX

REPORT NO. 1 OF THE BOARD OF MISSIONS

Your Board of Missions has heard with pleasure the report of progress made by our General Board of Missions and the recommendations for the future give promise of greater things. For the first time in a number of years new missionaries have gone to the field to reinforce and inspire the workers who for so long have held the lines there. The program is an advance all along the line. Wisely are we called to a fellowship of prayer. Convinced that any great success in the Kingdom must have its genesis in the home land, we are asked to co-operate with the Home Department of the Board in a program of church-wide evangelism. The missionary imperative must be restated in terms of the Great Commission and the Christ crucified for the sins of the world is to be presented as the sermons. We would commend to you the words of our General Secretary, spoken in a call to prayer made in his report to the Board in the session of May, 1928.

⁴⁴It is recommended that we call the church to prayer. Do we still believe that God can stretch forth his hand in the name of His Holy Son and do many mighty works in the world? Let us put Him to the test. The world needs Him. China is distraught and torn. Korea's economic conditions are appalling. America is materialistically minded, seeking ease and self-satisfaction. We need to put on sackcloth and ashes. Let us call our people everywhere to prayer."

Next to a spirit of prayer we would commend as essential the program of education in Missions. The results of the January-February cultural program have justified the action of the General Conference in projecting this movement. That which has here been so effectively done can surely be magnified by the Enlarged Plan of Missionary Education. In this is the basis of our continued progress.

Of peculiar interest is the call for a great International Missionary Conference to be held in Memphis, Tennessee, on the second and third of January, 1929. It offers a unique opportunity for education and inspiration. 100 reservations have been made for North Carolina Conference delegates. We urge a hearty co-operation with the Conference Director in securing a full delegation.

In the establishment of the Southern Biblical Institute the General Board is undertaking to meet a peculiar need. This school, which operates under the supervision of the Home Department of the Board, is located at Lake Junaluska and will open in the fall of 1929. The purpose of the school, as presented by the Board, is for the training of preachers and other Christian workers who desire to study but cannot qualify in the regular standard schools of the church. We pledge the General Board our hearty support in this enterprise.

We would reaffirm our faith in the policy of cultivation during January-February period. The Methodist Evangel, the book for study during this cultivation period, furnishes a text in the study of evangelism that will prove to be educational and inspirational. Every church in Southern Methodism should have a class using this book as a text.

Your Board of Missions, with the Conference Woman's Missionary Society, have set as a goal 1,000 new subscribers to the *Missionary Voice*. This magazine has come to have a unique place in missionary education. We endorse *The Voice* and pledge our support in its program for expansion. The results of the 1928 campaign for missionary maintenance have been disappointing in financial results. We are confident that the fine work done by our presiding elders and pastors will be fruitful in the coming years. Let us continue along the same lines and give to our leaders in this work the most loyal support.

We recommend as an ideal for the year:

First-1,000 new subscribers to the Missionary Voice.

Second-\$60,000 for missionary maintenance.

Third-A school of Missions and Evangelism in every congregation.

Your Board is asking Rev. W. V. McRae to raise in the conference \$500.00 for the support of a pastor at Oteen.

We recommend that the conference ask Rev. W. R. Royal to raise in the conference the sum of \$500.00 for a program of maintenance for our church at Chapel Hill.

We would commend the presiding elders and pastors for the fine work done in the missionary institutes held in each district of the conference and would ask the same hearty co-operation on their part with the Board and the Conference Missionary Secretary.

We recommend that Rev. F. S. Love be appointed as Conference Missionary Secretary.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

It is notable that with the increased interest in education throughout our nation our church seems determined to keep pace with the advancement in all lines, not only in smaller institutions of learning but also in the establishment of universities for the higher branches. The promotion of Christian education by our own church schools is a source of increasing interest as well as of pride to us all. The Methodist institutions in our state and conference are to be found in the forefront of this forward movement in education.

The church during the last year sustained a distinct loss in the death of the General Secretary of Education, Dr. Stonewall Anderson, and we note with sadness the failing health of Mr. B. N. Duke, an outstanding benefactor to our church schools, and also the serious illness of Mr. R. H. Wright, who has been especially liberal to Louisburg College.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION MOVEMENT

According to the statement of our General Education Board, The Christian Education Movement has technically closed. The plan for the collection of the remaining pledges will be worked out in coming days.

It is urged that Christian Education Day be observed during the month of June in accordance with the plans of the General Education Board.

It is also requested that the General Board of Education include the North Carolina Conference territory with that of the Western North Carolina Conference in making an educational survey of the state. It is understood that the expense of this will be borne by the General Board of Education.

PAINE COLLEGE

We commend the work of Paine College to our people and call upon them to lend their interest to this institution and the mission which it is carrying out. We ask them to pray for its progress and to lend their financial support to supplement the appropriation now being made by the General Board of Missions for the maintenance of this school for colored people.

The conference for the promotion of Christian Education that is being promoted by the General Board of Education, the General Sunday School Board and the General Epworth League Board, is hereby endorsed. This conference is to be held at Lake Junaluska next July 19-21.

DUKE UNIVERSITY

Duke University, grounded in the ideals and principles of Trinity College, has risen to a position of prominence not only in our church, but in the entire Southland and the nation. With the loyal support of her many friends and the generous provision made by Mr. James B. Duke, Duke University is now able to assume a position in which it will influence the entire thinking of the South. The North Carolina Conference pledges itself again to its continuous support. Religion now, as always, has a large emphasis there.

The twelve new buildings on the old campus have been completed and are in use this year. The gigantic building program on the new campus progresses with increasing efficiency and swiftness. The students are carefully selected and come from all parts of the world, with increasing numbers. Graduate schools are growing and the School of Religion is attracting great interest. To its already strong faculty, Dr. Gilbert T. Rowe has been added as Professor of Christian Doctrine. We shall miss Dr. E. D. Soper, Vice-President and Dean of the School of Religion, who has gone to another field of service. It is expected that by 1930 the new plant can be occupied and the College for Women occupy the old campus. The reorganized Law School and the School of Medicine are expected to be ready by this time. It is the avowed purpose of the Board of Trustees that Duke University shall provide an education that really educates and to make of our institution a mighty force for truth and righteousness in the world.

The number of students for the academic year of 1927-28 was 1,705. The number of students for the summer school of 1927 was 1,484. The number of officers and teachers is 123, exclusive of instructors.

The plant and equipment, the endowment and unexpended building fund amount to \$41,933,900.46. Of this amount the endowment is \$20,785,207.05. The value of Duke University loan fund is \$571,776.96.

GREENSBORO COLLEGE

Not only is our church making provision for the education of men and women at the same institution but it is also heartily supporting the education of women in separate colleges. The report from Greensboro College is gratifying. Additional room has been provided for boarding students as well as increased endowment during the year just passed. The donation of the library of Dr. R. F. Bumpas as well as some useful scientific instruments is noted with appreciation. As is the case with all of our educational institutions, Greensboro College is still in need of funds and we not only endorse the program of work there but also the continuation of the campaign of the college to raise \$500,000 in endowment.

We note with sadness the death of Rev. G. F. Smith during the year, who was a trustee and warm friend of this institution. We recommend the election and

confirmation of Rev. W. B. North of this conference to succeed Rev. G. F. Smith, whose term expires December 31, 1928, and also that he be elected and confirmed to succeed himself for a term of six years. We recommend that Rev. M. T. Plyler of this conference be elected and confirmed as trustee, representing the Alumnæ Association, his present term expiring December 31, 1928. We recommend the election and confirmation of Mr. Junius Wren, of Siler City, N. C., as trustee to succeed Mr. G. M. Carr, of Durham, N. C., representing the Alumnæ Association, whose term would have expired December 31, 1929.

The number of teachers at Greensboro College last year was 30, with 337 students.

The value of the property is \$713,289. The endowment amounts to \$351,-345.

The total indebtedness, \$33,812.

LOUISBURG COLLEGE

Louisburg College, with its history dating back to pioneer days, has experienced many struggles. The outlook today for the future seems exceptionally bright. The liberality of her friends and the loyal support of the church is making this possible. The generosity of Mr. R. H. Wright to Louisburg College is deeply appreciated. It is the purpose of the trustees of this institution to make of it the very best Junior College for Girls. We endorse the present plan to provide funds for the enlargement of the college. The number of teachers last session at Louisburg College was twenty-two and in compliance with a plan to improve the means of instruction, four additional teachers have been added to the Literary Departments. The student body numbers 298.

The net worth of Louisburg College is estimated at \$675,987.10. This is an increase of 617 per cent during the last five years.

The endowment amounts to \$100,000.

The current income of the college for the year ending June 30, 1928, was \$102,208.96.

We recommend the election of the following trustees of the class of 1931: Rev. S. A. Cotton, Mr. D. W. Newsome, Mr. C. S. Wallace, Rev. H. C. Smith and Mr. E. H. Cranmer. We recommend also the election of Rev. T. McM. Grant to fill out the unexpired term of Dr. N. H. D. Wilson, resigned, of the class of 1930, and Rev. F. S. Love to fill out the unexpired term of Rev. J. M. Daniel, resigned, of the class of 1929.

CAROLINA COLLEGE

In agreement with a resolution passed by this conference last year, Mr. H. A. McKinnon, receiver for Carolina College, announces that this institution has been sold to the Synod of the Presbyterian Church for the sum of approximately \$35,750 for the establishment of a boys' school. This amount will be sufficient, it is believed, to liquidate the indebtedness on Carolina College.

The Board of Education unanimously passed the following resolution and asks the concurrence of this body:

1. That any funds remaining in the hands of the receiver for Carolina College after the final settlement of the indebtedness on the same shall be placed in charge of the Chairman and the Treasurer of the North Carolina Conference Board of Education to be used as a loan fund for the purpose of aiding worthy students in our church schools who may be preparing for definite and full-time Christian service.

2. That of the funds appropriated to Carolina College by the last North

Carolina Annual Conference the sum of \$1,000 net shall be added to the abovementioned fund.

3. That the remainder of said last year's fund be returned to the Conference Treasurer with the recommendation that the amount be given to the Board of Missions to assist in its present emergency.

4. That the amount of \$1,000 be asked for this coming year to continue the loan fund herein-before provided for, the amount asked taking the place of \$5,000 heretofore asked for Carolina College.

We note with sadness the passing of Rev. S. E. Mercer, whose influence was largely felt in the history of Carolina College.

STUDENT PASTOR

A carefully prepared report was presented by Rev. J. G. Phillips, student pastor at Chapel Hill. His work in organizing and training the young men and women in attendance at our State University is to be commended.

We recommend that the General Board of Education continue its assistance in making adequate provision for the support of this student pastor.

RESOLUTION

The Board of Education of the North Carolina Conference recommends that the following resolution be adopted by the North Carolina Annual Conference in session at Wilson, N. C., this, the second day of November, 1928:

WHEREAS, Mr. R. H. Wright, of the County of Durham, State of North Carolina, has by deeds dated May 21, 1928, conveyed to the Board of Trustees of Louisburg College two certain lots or parcels of land situated in the City of Durham, State of North Carolina, and described as follows:

First tract, situated on the corner of Chapel Hill and Roney Streets in said City of Durham, and bounded and described as follows, to wit:

"Beginning at a point the inner edge of the sidewalk on the north side of Chapel Hill Street and the inner edge of the old sidewalk on the west side of Roney Street, and running thence in a westerly direction with and along the inner edge of the sidewalk on Chapel Hill Street a distance of 96°; thence north 2° and 30 minutes east 113.66 feet to a stake in a ten foot alley; thence with and along said alley south 87° and 55 minutes, east 104.25 feet to the inner edge of the old sidewalk on Roney Street; thence south 6° and 40 minutes west with and along the inner edge of the old sidewalk on Roney Street 114.4 feet to the beginning, and being Lots Nos. 16, 17, 18 and 19 of the William Mangum home place. Said lots were conveyed to R. H. Wright by deed of P. S. Hutchins, Trustee, dated the 17th day of September, 1907, recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds of Durham County in Book No. 37 of Deeds, page 363, and by deed of R. O. Everett, Trustee, dated the 15th day of March, 1915, and recorded in Deed Book No. 50, page 19, in the office of the Register of Deeds of Durham County, North Carolina. Saving, reserving and excepting, however, from the above description, and from the operation of this deed, a strip of land on the eastern side of said lot 19 feet wide on Chapel Hill Street and 19 feet wide on said ten foot alley, and extending along Roney Street from Chapel Hill Street, to said Alley (Now Manning place)."

Second tract, situated on the corner of Roxboro and Peabody Streets in the City of Durham, and bounded and described as follows, to wit:

"Beginning at a stake at the inside of the sidewalk on the east side of Roxboro Street and on the north side of Peabody Street, where the sidewalks of said streets intersect, and running thence with and along Roxboro Street in a northeasterly direction 108.5 feet to a stake, a 30° Street; thence with and along said 30 foot street in an easterly direction 282.68 feet to a stake, Johnson's line, thence with Johnson's line in a southerly direction 109.7 feet to the inner edge of the sidewalk on Peabody; thence with and along Peabody Street in a westerly direction 282.96 feet to the beginning."

And Whereas, said lots or parcels of land were given to the said Board of Trustees of Louisburg College for the use and benefit of said Louisburg College, the said lots or parcels of land to be sold or if necessary conveyed by mortgage or deeds of trust for the purpose of raising funds for building purposes and for the endowment of Louisburg College, and under the terms of an agreement under which said lots were given; it was agreed by the Trustees of Louisburg College that they would forthwith begin the erection on the Louisburg College campus of an auditorium and fine arts building to be known as The Richard H. Wright Auditorium, to cost not less than \$125,000;

And Whereas, in order to carry out this provision it will be necessary and advisable to either sell or convey by mortgage or deed of trust, said property;

And Whereas, by the charter of Louisburg College, it is among other things provided that "No conveyance of the real property vested in said corporation shall be made without the consent and permission of the North Carolina Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South," and such permission is requested by the Trustees of Louisburg College.

Now, Therefore, be it resolved by the said North Carolina Annual Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in session at Wilson, N. C., on this, the 2nd day of November, 1928, that the said North Carolina Conference hereby gives and grants unto the officers and trustees of Louisburg College its consent and permission to said officers and trustees or to the corporation, to sell and convey said property in fee simple or to borrow money thereon and convey by mortgage or deed of trust said property to secure the payment of said money so borrowed; and said money, the proceeds from said sale or borrowed as aforesaid, shall be used by the said corporation in accordance with the provisions of the gift of said R. H. Wright.

In giving its consent it is stipulated that the North Carolina Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, assumes no moral or legal responsibility for any obligation in connection with such conveyance of said property by the Trustees of Louisburg College.

On motion, the above resolution was duly adopted.

REPORT NO. 1 OF BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION

It is clearly manifest that there can be no permanent or adequate cultivation or development of the new or missionary fields unless the preachers are provided with reasonably comfortable dwellings and suitable places in which to assemble the people for preaching to them the Gospel. We have for years been expending missionary money in weak fields where the results have been all but negligible, because the physical equipment has been distressingly inadequate.

The Church Extension Board has been unable to go hand in hand with the Mission Board because the funds available to our board have been only about fifty per cent of the money appropriated by the Mission Board.

We, therefore, respectfully and earnestly request that the conference recommend to the Budget Commission that it fix the assessment for the Church Extension Board at \$10,000.00.

Second, that the conference approve the recommendation of the General Board that we set apart an amount each year as an emergency fund, the remainder of which at the close of each conference year be applied as an increase to the loan fund. We desire to set apart ten per cent of the amount received each year for this purpose.

Third, we earnestly insist that in every case where a new church or parson-

age is enterprised the architectural department of the Board of Church Extension be consulted.

Fourth, that the Conference place itself on record as discouraging either a loan or donation where the church or parsonage is not sufficiently protected by insurance.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

Your Sunday School Board submits the following report:

The Sunday school work of the conference goes forward without change of policy or organization.

Definite progress has been made during the year and we look forward to a new year with renewed hope and renewed enthusiasm.

Attention has been given to all the well-known and established lines of work. Teacher Training work has been stressed, fifteen Standard Training schools and fifty-one Cokesbury schools have been held. These in conjunction with colleges, pastors' schools, training classes and correspondence courses have amassed a total of 2,996 Standard Certificates of Credit, and 842 Cokesbury credits, an increase of approximately 300 over the previous year.

Improvement in buildings and material equipment has been stressed. The Conference Superintendent has worked in co-operation with the representative of the Duke Endowment and local congregations in the matter of the erection of new Sunday school buildings, and of additions to churches of Sunday school rooms. Much building has been done during the year, not only in the larger towns but in rural sections as well. Under a revised system of checking schools in their Programs of Work, a better understanding of these programs has been fostered, and a better appreciation on the part of the churches of their value has been noted; the checking has become more effective, and its value to the local schools has increased.

An increased observance of the fourth Sunday missionary program and collection under the plan of the Dual Special is apparent. The value of this growth both to the work of extension in our conference, and to the life of the local schools, cannot be over-estimated. Under the new agreement between the Board of Missions and the General Sunday School Board, the foreign half of the Dual Special is directed to religious education in foreign fields and especially to mission work in China. This should meet with the enthusiastic support of all our people. This marks the first unbroken year of the work of our Extension Secretary. We are more than gratified with the work that has been done and the results achieved.

The observance of Sunday School Day has been maintained at about the same level of former years, but there still remains a considerable number of schools that do not remit the Sunday School Day collections to the Board Treasurer.

A most successful conference-wide conference was held in Fayetteville March 29-30. In point of attendance, unified programs, outstanding public addresses, and genuine work, it was perhaps the best Conference we have ever held so far.

Following the plans as outlined in our report of last year, eight of the nine districts of the conference have been organized into District Councils. The value of this step became at once apparent. In most instances consecrated and enthusiastic workers have been found, and they have greatly multiplied the effectiveness of our program, especially in reaching places not possible before. These workers have been especially helpful in the matter of one day institutes and it is planned to push this form of service during the coming year.

WE RECOMMEND

 That we continue promotion of Sunday school and allied work in religious education in keeping with the policies of the General Sunday School Board, the details to be worked out by district and conference councils.

2. That we foster the continuation in each district of a District Sunday School Council, to meet as soon after Conference as practicable, to set up such goals as are in keeping with our general policies, and to assume certain definite responsibilities for the attainment of these goals.

3. That we accept with thanks the invitation of Centenary, Smithfield, to hold our sixth annual conference-wide conference in Smithfield and designate April 2-3, 1929, as the date for the meeting.

4. We are pleased to report the re-election of Mr. L. L. Gobbel as Conference Superintendent of Sunday School Work, at \$3,500.00 per annum; of Miss Georgia S. Keene, as Elementary Superintendent, at \$2,000.00 per annum; and we recommend the appointment of Rev. J. O. Long as Extension Secretary, at \$3,000.00 per annum. Each with traveling expenses, including automobile travel allowance at 8c per mile.

Your board feels that these workers have given of their best efforts to the work in which they are employed and that the results of their work will become more apparent as the seed which they are sowing has time to mature to the harvest.

REPORT OF EPWORTH LEAGUE BOARD

Appreciable gains in the furtherance of our young people's League program were registered among the tangible results which we report for last year:

Our 297 Leagues, with 9,500 members, contributed \$3,662 for missions, and \$13,037 for other purposes. Without intention of odious comparison, but in defense and justice to our so criticised young people we point out that our 700 Sunday schools of the conference with more than ten times the membership contributed less than three times the amount of our young Leaguers for missions, without a secretariat and office force.

More than 350 Leaguers registered for courses at the Louisburg Summer Assembly. 260 certificates of credit and seven Christian Culture diplomas were awarded. There were nineteen Life Service volunteers at the closing consecration altar service at the close of the assembly.

For the first time a course in Epworth League work was offered this summer in the Pastors' School at Duke University, with twenty-five enrolled. This course was given in lieu of the special training of the graduate students and League pastors who desired to use these students sent out by the Duke Commission in the interest of rural church extension and their program of human conservation and leadership training of our youth.

The board expresses its grateful appreciation to the Duke Commission for the aid of the three well-trained and earnest workers used in the Elizabeth City, Raleigh, and Weldon Districts during the summer, and it desires to co-operate with Duke in the continuance and enlargement of this most promising pioneer work.

We urge the presiding elders, pastors and District Secretaries to take the initiative in asking for, through us, such men for next summer, and assume the responsibility, with us, of arranging early a schedule of tentative dates of most convenience for these workers in the most fertile fields, to the end that the experiment tried out and proved of inestimable worth this year may be more fruitful of results on an enlarged scale next year.

The board further recommends that its annual meeting be fixed for Friday at 2:30 p. m. of conference week, the day of the Duke banquet, that the nine lay members of the board representing the several districts be notified ten days in advance, that the nine District Secretaries together with the student workers and the Conference Epworth League President meet with the board and render written reports of their undertakings, needs and accomplishments, in order that your board may be informed and function as intended in the several districts throughout the year as the executive head and servant of our great church and the Epworth League as the organization to which we look for finding and training leaders in our day of educational advantages, scientific advancement, and accompanying transition period, through whom alone we may hope to conserve our greatest human resources and solve our young people's problem by giving them their part and proper place in the work of the kingdom.

REPORT OF BOARD OF CHRISTIAN LITERATURE

It is apparent that the conditions now prevalent throughout our home communities necessitate more diligent attention to the constant circulation of Christian literature among our people, and that as a preventive of that ignorance which so surely arrests spiritual culture; and, therefore, bars progress in all church activities. The lack of information, such as is supplied by our publishing agencies, as to our great church enterprises, largely accounts for indifference to real progress. It is true of present-day conditions, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge." "Alienated from the life of God through the ignorance that is in them."

As members of your Board of Christian Literature we are pleased to present to the conference the substance of reports concerning some of our most vital interests.

NORTH CAROLINA CHRISTIAN ADVOCATE

It is certainly a praiseworthy aspiration in the management of our conference paper to make it the very best of papers; and we heartily commend said management for the great wisdom shown in enlarging the equipment, in providing an efficient job printing department, in increasing the actual size of the paper, and in insisting on a larger paid-up list of subscribers.

With the annual amount of business represented by more than \$62,000.00, with an income from all sources of more than \$61,000, and with the small loss of \$621.00 for the year, we think that the whole of North Carolina Methodism has renewed reasons vigorously to rally to the increased circulation of our Carolina Advocate. And we, therefore, recommend that the proposed special effort to be put forth soon after this Conference be persistently participated in by all our people, that the number of *bona fide* subscriptions may advance from 13,500 to 16,000, at the least, or one new subscriber to every 100 church members. Let there be an Advocate Sunday observed by every pastor in every congregation, and this be followed by a thorough canvass of absent ones.

We respectfully request Rev. M. T. Plyler's reappointment as Associate Editor and Business Manager, his salary to be \$5,000.00, embracive of residence rental. Too, that Hon. H. A. Page be re-elected to succeed himself for the usual term of five years as a member of the Methodist Board of Publication.

PUBLISHING HOUSE

It is gratifying that our Publishing House business steadily gains volume, as is shown by the net profit the past fiscal year of \$130,586.45, meaning an increase of more than \$12,000.00 over the previous year, and an appropriation of \$75,000.00 to Conference Claimants.

While there has been no perceptible increase in the circulation of the Christian Advocate and Methodist Quarterly Review, still this Board believes in the real merit of these periodicals, and earnestly asks that they be given the most liberal and loval support.

We would heartily commend our alert Publishing Agents for having established a Department of Free Tracts, promotive, as they are, of the Doctrines of Methodism, the History and Polity of our Church, Evangelism, and Christian Stewardship. We are confident that, by discreet and special use of such tracts, our pastors may create a more intelligent and consecrated membership.

There is no literature comparable to our own for making more efficient the Sunday schools of our Methodism, and we urge that it be faithfully used.

REPORT OF BOARD OF TEMPERANCE AND SOCIAL SERVICE

The noblest reform of our country was secured to America when the Eighteenth Amendment was ratified by forty-six sovereign states. Congress wisely enacted legislation looking to its enforcement. North Carolina did likewise. This action secured the legislation and machinery for concurrent enforcement by state and nation. These laws came as the fulfillment of the prayers and earnest efforts of the Christian men and women and other good citizens, who saw the havoc of the home and the curse to society of the licensed liquor evil. In the long crusade for outlawing drink and drunkenness the early Methodists were standing shoulder to shoulder with other militant pioneer crusaders against the debauchery of drink. John Wesley and his circuit riders never hesitated to oppose the liquor traffic and to hold up drink as the worst foe of the church and the home.

The church today stands where it has always stood, as is evidenced in the following declaration by the General Conference of May, 1926.

The pronouncement of the Bishops on the national prohibition law should be read from every pulpit in the church. It is a clarion call which should ring throughout our borders and stir all supporters for prohibition and temperance to action. Facts submitted to us from all the states confirm our faith in prohibition as a national policy. From every quarter comes but one report: that moral and civic conditions under prohibition, while not ideal, are incomparably better than under the old policy. These reports reassure us in the conviction that "prohibition at its worst is better than the licensed policy at its best." We have taken note of the factors tending to prevent the due observance and proper enforcement of the law. Chief among them are these:

(1) The campaign for the nullification of the Eighteenth Amendment under the guise of proposals to modify the Volstead Act.

(2) The patronizing of the lowest criminals by men of prominence and influence resulting in the enriching of the former and the setting up of the latter as inciters of drunkenness and official corruption.

(3) THE APPOINTMENT AND ELECTION to office of men who prefer to demonstrate that the law cannot be enforced rather than that it can be enforced.

(4) The disposition to shirk and evade local responsibility resulting in a failure to exercise state and local authority with fidelity and vigor.

(5) Over-confidence and lack of vigilance and diligence on the part of the friends of temperance and prohibition. The peril of prohibition, as well as of all popular government, is "not so much in the bad citizenship of bad men as in the bad citizenship of good men." These conditions challenge us to action.

The campaign for nullification must be answered by a crusade for observance and enforcement. Men of prominence and influence who strike hands withpatronize and enrich—the lowest criminal classes must be *indicted at the bar of public opinion as their confederates and accomplices. The law must be administered by its friends.* In our states from constable to governor—in the nation from revenue officer to president, officials must be selected who believe in enforcement not only because it is the law but because it ought to be the law.

The full power and authority of the states must be exercised in co-operation with the Federal Government. For the attainment of these ends, we call upon our preachers and teachers to give voice to the social creed of the church and upon all our people to assert their *full influence as Christians and patriotic citizens of our republic.* We recommend that these sentiments be declared to be the sentiments of the conference!

Thus the General Conference spoke in May, 1928.

It required many years of struggle and sacrifice to secure the legal outlawing of the saloon and still. That victory must not be placed in jeopardy either by amending or repealing the Eighteenth Amendment or flagrant failure to uphold the law and the Constitution. The call today, when some officials have betrayed their trust by failure to give sincere and efficient enforcement to the law and other public leaders with to end national prohibition, either by nullification, amendment or repeal, is for all who wish a sober nation to stand guard against weak or corrupt enforcement, nullification, amendment or repeal. The crying need is for all faithful enforcement and opposition to weakening the prohibition law, which, in spite of the lack of whole-hearted and real enforcement on the part of some officials, has lessened drumkenness, increased prosperity and promises to make our country free from the debasing influences that always follow in the train of the manufacture and the sale of intoxicants.

Drink is the fruitful mother of other evils and of crime and disease. Preaching in its pulpits for a century against the legalized liquor traffic, Methodism owes the duty today to ring clear and true against undermining national prohibition by the laxness of officials, the advocacy of lawlessness by a portion of the press and the violation of the laws.

Concurrent with its devotion to the Eighteenth Amendment and its enforcement, our church, allied with all the evangelical churches, urges upon all the people, as the hope of *cleaner lives*, *better homes and purer joys* the duty to observe the *principle of total abstinence*. Let our preachers today and tomorrow as in all the past *cry aloud and spare not against the demoralization of strong drink*.

Let our people set an example in old time Methodist opposition to social drinking, always dangerous and now under the ban of the law. No one can make or sell or transport intoxicants without encouraging disrespect for and violation of the law. Contempt for law breeds anarchy. Let us render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's and sound the challenge of observance of the Eighteenth Amendment by our membership. Let us give cordial support to all officials who uphold the Eighteenth Amendment and all laws enacted in conformity thereto, as well as to all other laws.

Our church is fixed and forward in this religious battle. It will stand today, tomorrow and all the tomorrows for national prohibition, unamended and for righteous and effective enforcement. "To your tents, Oh Israel."

On the first day of the meeting of the annual conference, before figuring any percentage, the Conference Treasurer is directed to pay to the Treasurer of the local church, where the conference is held, the sum of \$3,000 for conference expense; he is also directed to pay to the Conference Secretary \$1,600 to cover his salary, incidental expenses and the printing of the Conference Journal; to the Statistical Secretary, \$200.00, and to the Conference Treasurer, \$300.00, to cover their salaries.

Your commission recommends that out of all the amounts collected from the grand total of \$229,360 the distribution shall be made by the Conference Treasurer on the following basis: 60.9 per cent to the conference work and 39.1 per cent to the General Conference work.

On motion in the regular meeting a year ago it was ordered that the books of the Conference Treasurer be audited. The books were audited during the year by W. F. Dixon, Certified Accountant, of Raleigh, N. C. The report of the auditor is entered upon the records of the commission.

In the annual meeting of the commission in November, 1927, it was ordered by unanimous vote that the Secretary shall make the apportionments to the districts on the basis of assessments to the support of the ministry rather than on the amounts paid. The above assessments have been made accordingly.

Your commission insists that the reports of some of the committees are very long. The expense of printing of the minutes can be very much reduced if the reports can be made more brief.

REPORT NO. 2 OF COMMISSION ON BUDGET

Your Commission on Budget had before them a paper from the Joint Commission of the Church Building at Chapel Hill, asking that our conference assume one-half of \$62,000 as part of the indebtedness on that church, and that a special of \$10,000 be raised each year to pay this debt. The effect of this would be to take over the responsibility for raising approximately \$31,000 for that church.

After considering the matter, we agreed to refer it to the conference with the following suggestion:

We believe this is a worthy cause, however unfortunate its present status may appear, but we do not deem it wise to assume so large an indebtedness at this time with present financial embarrassments before us, nor do we believe it would prove helpful to the cause under consideration.

However, we suggest that if the conference is willing, we undertake to raise \$5,000 by a voluntary special this year, said amount to be apportioned to the various districts.

ORPHANAGE REPORT

Your Orphanage Committee submits the following report:

The annual conference of 1927 endorsed the building program authorized by the Board of Trustees for the raising of \$100,000 for the erection of three new dormitories in order to meet the urgent demand upon our Orphanage to provide for one hundred additional children. This campaign was put on shortly after the adjournment of the conference and resulted in the raising of \$25,000. This, together with other funds on hand, has made possible the erection of two of the three new buildings contemplated this year. These buildings will take care of about sixty children, and will increase the Orphanage capacity from 255 to about 315 children. Already about thirty-five additional children have been taken, increasing the number from 255 to 290. We desire to thank the trustees, pastors, and members of our churches for their fine spirit of co-operation and their liberal contributions, which have made possible the erection of these two new buildings.

Tremendous pressure is being brought to bear upon the Orphanage at present to take at least 25 more children. These, together with the additional ones already taken, will increase the operating expenses of the Orphanage from \$15,000 to \$18,000. This will make it necessary for the Orphanage to have at least this amount of money in addition to what it had last year. In view of a strong disposition on the part of a great many of our preachers and churches to oppose an increased assessment for any cause, we do not think it wise to increase the assessment for the coming year. But we do urge that our people endeavor to raise this additional amount by making the most of the Thanksgiving period. We recommend and suggest that our pastors hold Thanksgiving services in each of their churches with a strong appeal and a liberal offering for the Orphanage in every congregation. In the case of circuits, we suggest that the months of November and December be used for the holding of these services and the taking of these offerings in the different churches. We also suggest that the Sunday schools and Sunday school classes continue their monthly offerings for the Orphanage and try to increase the amount of their offerings this year as far as possible.

It is very gratifying to your committee to know that the Orphanage is being handled on a very wise and sound economic basis. The report of Brothen Barnes shows that the cost of each child is about \$.80 per day, or about \$25.00 per month. According to the figures submitted by the Duke Foundation, this is about \$36.50 less per child than the average cost per annum of the ten largest orphanages in the two Carolinas. And he believes the per capita cost this year will be even less than that of last year. We take pleasure in giving this information to our people to counteract any feeling or false impression abroad of waste or lack of economy at our Orphanage, and to commend Brother Barnes for the fine and efficient way in which he is administering the financial affairs of our institution.

The annual revival services this year were conducted by Rev. W. P. Watkins of City Road, Elizabeth City. As a result of these services fifty-one were added to Jenkins Memorial Church, fifty on profession of faith, and one by vows.

The Orphanage classes visited about two hundred or more churches this year and rendered sacred concerts. A free will offering was taken at each place which more than paid the expenses of the trip. We consider this one of the finest ways of bringing the Orphanage to the attention of our people and showing the character of work it is doing among its children. We suggest that Brother Barnes continue to follow this plan and that an effort be put forward to reach as many churches as possible through the year.

On account of the crowded conditions at the Orphanage and its desire to be of the largest possible service to all, we suggest that only the most worthy and urgent cases be presented for application to this institution.

There are a great many men and women in our church who are amply able to support one or more children in the home at \$25.00 per month. To thus establish a living link between the giver and the child will prove a blessing to each. We urge that this be done wherever it is possible.

Realizing the urgent need for a larger endowment, one that will take care of fifty per cent of the operating expenses of the Orphanage, we suggest that the major emphasis this year be an effort to greatly increase our endowment rather than an effort to carry forward a wider building program. This may be done in several ways. In the first place, we may write the Orphanage in a large way in our wills. It may also be done by purchasing Orphanage Annuity Bonds. These bonds pay from six to eight per cent semi-annually, are nontaxable, and offer the best of security. This ought to be sufficient inducement to our elderly people to secure our Annuity Bonds. Still another way is by taking out insurance policies and making the Orphanage the beneficiary of such funds. This movement was inaugurated by Mr. Roger Moore, of Grace Church, Wilmington, and is endorsed by the executive committee of the Orphanage. We urge that our preachers use all of these means, wherever possible, for increasing the Orphanage endowment.

We recommend that Rev. A. S. Barnes be reappointed Superintendent of the Orphanage with a salary of \$4,000 fixed by the Board of Trustees.

REPORT NO. 1 OF BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES ON THE SOUTHERN ASSEMBLY

For fifteen years the Southern Assembly at Lake Junaluska, N. C., has been maintained and operated by a private corporation for the benefit of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. The stockholders of the Southern Assembly in a meeting called for that purpose voted to transfer all the property to the General Board of Lay Activities of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, to be held in trust until all indebtedness shall have been paid and the holders of capital stock have been paid an amount equal to the par value of said stock, except such stock as may be donated to the Board of Lay Activities, when said property shall be conveyed in fee simple to the General Board of Lay Activities of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South.

The Board of Lay Activities after careful consideration made plans to accept the trust, and will now become responsible for the management of the institution and for making provisions to liquidate the indebtedness.

We desire to call your attention to the following facts:

1. The property which the board will hold in trust for the church consists of the following: 600 acres of land; 250 acre lake; an auditorium with seating capacity of 3,500; 135-room hotel; nine-hole golf course; administration building; boat house; bath house; parks; roads, etc. The value of this property is worth several times the amount of the indebtedness and the outstanding stock.

2. Among the schools, conferences and camps held annually at Lake Junaluska are the following:

Sunday School Leadership Training School.
Mission School.
Epworth League Assemblies.
Laymen's Conference.
Bible and Evangelistic Conference.
Junaluska Summer School of Religion (Under joint auspices of Duke University School of Religion and General Sunday School Board).
Young People's Conference.
Camps for Girls.
Camps for Boys.
Sermons, lectures and Chautauqua features under direction of the Assembly.

3. Our plan for liquidating the indebtedness of the Southern Assembly is the sale of lots to churches. There are approximately 2,400 lots for sale at \$500.00, \$750.00, and \$1,000.00 each. These lots will be sold to churches on the following terms: One-fourth in cash and the balance in three equal annual installments, no interest on deferred payments.

This plan contemplates that churches purchasing lots will erect lodges thereon so that at different periods during the summer season Sunday school workers, Leaguers, laymen, missionary society workers, other groups in the church, and the pastor and his family may occupy the lodges and attend the various conferences in which they may be interested.

Already a number of churches in this and other conferences have agreed to purchase lots.

In view of the action of the stockholders of the Southern Assembly and the General Board of Lay Activities, and in view of the great service being rendered to the church by the Southern Assembly, we make the following recommendations:

1. We heartily endorse the action of the General Board of Lay Activities in accepting this trusteeship.

2. We approve the plan of selling lots to churches and urge the laymen of every church to purchase a lot and erect a summer lodge thereon.

 We hope that the laymen in the territory of this conference will supplement the funds received on sales of lots by making donations to the General Board of Lay Activities to be used in liquidating the indebtedness and making needed improvements.

4. That our pastors and church lay leaders call the attention of our congregations through the church bulletins and the pulpit to the various meetings scheduled for Lake Junaluska and to the importance of the Southern Assembly as an educational institution of our church.

REPORT NO. 2 OF BOARD OF LAY ACTIVITIES

Realizing the importance of benevolences to the growth and spiritual uplift of the church, the Board of Lay Activities of the North Carolina Conference stressed the necessity of a full collection of all benevolences. We deplore the tendency of some of our people to put less emphasis on benevolences than upon preacher's salary and other local church obligations. For our church to go forward in its world program, we cannot fail to meet any of our assessments.

We recommend, first, that the lay leaders and preachers make it their goal to collect one-half of the benevolences by District Conference.

Second, that as soon as practicable after the annual conference, our lay leaders and associates plan a meeting or meetings for the education and inspiration of our people along all lines of our church endeavor.

And, third, that we strive to have an every-member canvass in each church throughout the conference in order to secure a contribution from every man, woman and child.

We wish to stress the importance of stewardship cultivation in every local church, and that we circulate literature among our people to that end.

We wish to call attention to the Methodist Layman as the official organ of the Board of Lay Activities and that our lay leaders make an earnest effort to circulate this publication in their churches.

We approve the plan of the General Board to hold a great convention of

laymen at Lake Junaluska next summer, and we pledge our support to this end. Many of our churches are not properly designated by signs, and we pledge ourselves as laymen this year to make a special effort to place a marker on or

about each church building belonging to us so that one passing by will know that it is a Methodist Church.

We nominate Dr. W. P. Few, of Durham, as our Conference Lay Leader.

REPORT OF JOINT COMMISSION

The Joint Commission of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and the Methodist Protestant Church of North Carolina, submit the following report:

Methodist Protestant Church of North Carolina, submit the following report: 1. We are glad to note that the sending of Fraternal Messengers from the conferences of one denomination to those of the other has brought about a better understanding between the denominations, and has also aided in creating a closer Christian Fellowship. So far, so good. But your committee feels that the time has come when these two denominations operating in the same territory, fighting a common foe, and striving in the same way to build up the Kingdom of Jesus Christ in North Carolina, should begin a closer and a more active cooperation in a few communities in this state. This, we believe, can be done to the glory of God and to the advancement of His Kingdom.

We believe that in a few communities like Liberty, Siler City, Gibsonville, Osipee-Altamahaw, West Burlington, Graham, Haw River, Mebane and other like communities where there is a Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and a Methodist Protestant Church, and where pastors of these churches are serving on salaries ranging from \$400 to \$1,500, that in such communities surely God would have us exercise business judgment and common sense and, religion sufficient to begin to work out a plan by which one Methodist pastor may serve each one of these communities, instead of two pastors as we now have. At present, pastors in such communities are having to serve on salaries which are scarcely living salaries when they could pay one decent salary, and in some cases, have a resident pastor where there is no resident pastor. We recommend, therefore, that this scheme be tried out definitely in certain carefully selected communities.

We suggest the following plan of operation for the beginning of the cooperation in the communities which may be chosen. And we express the hope that the plan will work so well that many similar communities will soon be thus co-operating.

THE PLAN

(1) The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, shall appoint a pastor to one of the communities, and the Methodist Protestant Church shall appoint a pastor to the other one.

(2) The pastor when thus appointed shall preach one Sunday in the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, and in the Methodist Protestant Church the next Sunday, thus alternating, and thus giving half time to each church for the entire year. And he shall be the pastor of all Methodists represented in the membership of both churches in the community to which he has been assigned, and his salary shall be paid jointly by the two congregations. And it shall be the pastor's duty to conform to the rules and regulations laid down in the Discipline of each church in holding Quarterly Conferences and in making report of his work and of the money raised to the two conferences he is thus serving.

(3) The Sunday school in the two churches shall continue as at present, and the pastor shall divide his time equally between the two.

(4) The Ladies' Aid Society and the Woman's Missionary Society shall also continue as at present, or in accordance with the laws of their own church.

(5) The pastor may hold mid-week prayer service in each church, or he may hold a union mid-week prayer service as per agreement with the congregations concerned.

(6) The pastors may also hold two revival services, or one union revival service for the two churches as per agreement with the congregations concerned.

(7) The property of each church in the respective communities shall be held just as it is now held.

2. We commend most heartily the effort to wisely consolidate rural churches where it can be done to the advantage of Kingdom interests.

3. We recommend to the annual conference that an invitation be extended to the Christian Church (The O'Kelley Branch) to elect six members to cooperate with this commission. This invitation to be extended through the Commission on Methodist Co-operation when sanctioned by the respective annual conferences.

4. Following the agreement of a year ago, that the term of office of two members of the Joint Commission, representing each of the two denominations, should expire each year, Rev. C. B. Culbreth and Fred N. Tate were nominated by the group of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, for the election by their conferences, respectively, the North Carolina Conference and the Western North Carolina Conference. The matter of electing two members by the Methodist Protestant Conference was referred to the Nominating Committee of that conference.

REPORT OF THE DUKE FUND COMMISSION

In submitting another report of this commission we would call attention to the following items:

1. Rev. E. F. Lee has been nominated to represent the Board of Church Extension on the commission, and Rev. J. M. Ormond has been nominated to represent the Board of Missions on the commission.

2. Last summer The Duke Endowment sent out twenty-two young preachers to assist pastors on country circuits. The work done by these men was of a high type and justified the continuation of this plan. We would advise pastors who desire student assistants next summer to send in applications to Professor Ormond soon after conference. The following statistics indicate a few of the results obtained on the circuits where these young men were placed as assistants last summer:

The twenty-two men served 101 churches and preached 442 sermons. They assisted in 60 revival meetings which resulted in the addition of 299 new members, 255 being received on profession of faith. They conducted 43 training classes during the summer with a total of 270 credits issued. 17 Vacation Bible Schools were conducted with a total enrollment of 831.

3. We desire to express our endorsement of the resolution in the report of the Board of Managers of the Pastors' School, 1927, requesting that the conference continue to publish in the Journals the report of each church in the circuits, and heartily commend this action on the part of the Board of Managers.

4. There will be forthcoming in the near future a book by Professor Ormond containing much valuable information about rural conditions in North Carolina, with especial attention given to the country church.

5. We repeat our statement of a year ago, viz.: The effort to aid in building churches by securing plans and advising in the undertaking is making headway, but there is still need for fuller co-operation between local committees and the office at Durham. A joint effort of patient planning and careful cooperation will save the embarrassment of heavy debts and the failure to get money to carry out certain plans, too often ill suited to the situation.

REPORT OF JOINT COMMISSION ON THE CHURCH BUILDING AT CHAPEL HILL

Your Commission on the Church Building at Chapel Hill submits the following report:

The erection of the church building at Chapel Hill was completed nearly two years ago, and the various furnishings, such as pews, carpet, pulpit, and communion furniture, have been installed. The plant is proving itself adequate as a social, educational, and religious center for the 900 Methodist students who attend the University, and, on account of its strategic location with reference to town and University, fully meets the demands made upon it by the students, local congregation, and community.

At the last sessions of the two co-operating conferences, action was taken to secure \$12,000 from each conferences as a special fund to reduce the indebtedness and to provide a small maintenance fund, the present indebtedness on the church being \$72,318.18.

At a meeting of the Joint Commission and the Board of Stewards of the local church at Chapel Hill held on October 11, 1928, an agreement was reached by which the Chapel Hill congregation will assume \$10,000 of this indebtedness with interest from date, provided the conferences assume the remaining indebtedness of approximately \$62,000. This would make the total contribution of the local congregation to the building program, including church and parsonage, \$34,000.

Your commission, therefore, recommends that the two co-operating conferences assume an equal part of this indebtedness and that the plan to carry this item as a special be continued, that an amount of \$10,000 be asked from each conference the coming year, and that the Commissions on Budget be requested to allot this asking to the several districts of the respective conferences.

The financial statement of the commission as of October 11 is attached. It will be seen that interest on the whole indebtedness will be due in December in addition to a payment of \$3,000 on the principal of the note to the Jefferson Standard Life Insurance Company. The money to meet these obligations was supposed to have been collected during the year now closing, and the urgency of the situation confronting the commission is obvious. Your commission has been most favorably impressed with the work with the students and University community made possible through the efforts of the conferences, and bespeaks the sustained support of the conferences and their Boards of Missions in continuing the program now being carried out at Chapel Hill.

REPORT NO. 1 OF THE HOSPITAL BOARD

Your board begs leave to submit the following as its report No. 1:

Mr. A. E. White, a member of our board, is a director of the Thompson Memorial Hospital, of Lumberton, N. C. Mr. White has, in behalf of the city of Lumberton and owners of the Thompson Memorial Hospital, made a tentative offer of that property to this conference. The hospital is two years old and was built and equipped at a cost of \$112,000.00. The Trustees of the Duke Foundation have now under consideration a grant to this institution that would clear it of debt and turn it into a Duke Foundation Community Hospital. Mr. White and other large stockholders feel that it would be better for the hospital to be taken over by the Methodist Church and that the Duke Foundation would just as readily co-operate in such a plan. These officials further believe that nearly, if not all, of the \$47,000.00 of outstanding stock would be donated by the owners to secure such a result. If both these expectations are realized, this new and splendidly equipped little hospital now renting for \$6,000 per year would become the property of the church for an outlay of ten or twelve thousand dollars or less. Your board believes this obligation could be

easily carried until liquidated out of the annual results of the Golden Cross Enrollment; or the rental of the hospital would pay it off in three years if the present arrangement is continued.

Your board was not willing to turn down such an offer without careful investigation. We, therefore, recommend that you request the Bishop to appoint a special commission of nine—four laymen and five preachers—to meet as soon as practicable and take the whole matter under advisement; to work out the terms of the transfer, if a transfer seems advisable, and to manage the enterprise until the next session of the annual conference, in co-operation with the Duke Foundation and with the General Hospital Board of our church, provided that: the entire debt now standing against the hospital is liquidated by grant from the Duke Foundation or otherwise; and provided that not more than ten or twelve thousand dollars of the stock remains to be paid for by the church.

REPORT NO. 2 OF THE HOSPITAL BOARD

We rejoice to see that the ministry of healing is attracting the attention of our church and that there is a possibility and probability of our own conference owning its own hospital.

In report No. 1 of the Hospital Board, adopted by the conference Wednesday morning, granting the Hospital Board a commission, to be appointed by Bishop Mouzon, with the authority and power to take over Thompson Memorial Hospital, Lumberton, N. C., provided it could be so done within the expenditure of an amount not to exceed twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000), we wish to ask that in case the aforesaid commission find that it is necessary to expend more than twelve thousand dollars to secure the aforesaid hospital that the said Hospital Board commission be empowered and granted the authority to exceed \$12,000.00in its expenditure for this matter, provided it does not exceed the expenditure of \$15,000.00. We further ask that in case the above mentioned Hospital Board commission should fail to secure Thompson Memorial Hospital, that the conference hereby authorize the General Hospital Board, until further notice, to devote all Golden Cross funds received by it, from this conference, to the hospital at Tucson, Arizona, to the credit of this conference.

We further ask that you recommend that the Budget Commission grant the Conference Board the sum of \$200.00 for the carrying on of its work in the conference.

We further ask that the conference ask Bishop Mouzon to appoint W. H. Brown Conference Golden Cross Director.

We further ask that the conference request all pastors to send all money raised for the Golden Cross to R. A. Brown, Conference Treasurer.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EVANGELISM

The reports of our pastors this year show a distressing shortage in collections for benevolences. Obviously these collections are essential for the successful prosecution of the vital work of the church.

As vital as the material interests of the church may be, we must remember that its spiritual life and work is first and supreme. The salvation of souls is our first work.

So, while we deplore the shortage in material resources, we have reason for greater distress of soul and searching of heart because of the comparatively small number received this year on profession of faith.

Therefore, your Committee on Evangelism calls upon this conference fervently to pray that the Holy Spirit may restore unto us the power of evangelism that has characterized Methodism. Let us, as pastors and laymen, dedicate ourselves to the holy task of winning the great unsaved and unchurched masses to Jesus Christ and the church.

The members of this committee disclaim any wisdom that others do not have, to tell our brethren how this may be done. But we do implore the church, ministry and laity, to have the spirit of John Knox when he said, "Give me Scotland or I die."

It is manifest, however, that the old method of revivalism alone is not sufficient. There are three effective means of evangelism that we must employ: First, is the series of revival services. Second, evangelism in the Sunday school. Third, personal evangelism.

We do not advise against the employment of our vocational evangelists. But we emphasize the importance of pastoral evangelism. Let our pastors be evangelists in their own charges. Let them assist one another in revivals.

The mission study book to be used during the missionary cultivation period this winter is "The Methodist Evangel." The purpose of this is to rekindle in the church the evangelistic fire and to educate in evangelistic methods. We earnestly recommend a large use of this book in all our churches.

We fervently pray that our God will direct us into large undertakings this year and that we may come to the next annual conference rejoicing because of the prosperity of our Zion in the salvation of many souls.

REPORT OF COMMISSION ON BENEVOLENCES

The Commission on Benevolences composed of the Presidents of the various Conference Boards met in regular session yesterday (Friday) afternoon. Rev. Daniel Lane was elected President of the commission and E. C. Few Secretary.

Dr. J. E. Crawford, Stewardship Secretary of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, was present and brought to the commission the following pointed recommendations which were considered individually and unanimously endorsed by the commission:

(1) That the President of this commission co-operate with the several presiding elders of the nine districts of the North Carolina Conference in securing for each district a minister to speak with telling effect upon the subject of the benevolences at the first pastors' institute of the new conference year.

(2) That the President of each of the Conference Boards prepare a paper as to why his board should receive its full amount of the benevolences.

(3) That this commission endorse the stewardship program for the year 1929.

(4) That this commission prepare and distribute through our entire conference an appeal for the payment of the benevolences in full this year; this appeal to be drafted by Drs. W. P. Few and W. A. Stanbury, and its effective distribution to be heartily co-operated in by the Presidents of the various Conference Roards.

SPECIAL REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON ADMISSIONS

Facing the important duties committed to it by this conference, the Committee on Admissions asks the endorsement and the co-operation of the conference membership in the enforcement of the following rules:

1. All candidates for admission on trial and ministers coming from other churches must be recommended and sponsored, either by the presiding Bishop or by a presiding elder of the conference.

2. All candidates must supply the committee with such information as called for in the Discipline (Par. 826) and outlined in the questionnaire furnished by the committee. This information must be in the possession of the committee at or before its first meeting prior to opening session of conference.

3. Candidates for admission should meet the educational standards of our church as set forth in the Discipline (Par. 824). In those "special" cases where the candidate fails to meet the educational standard, the presiding elder representing the candidate must present to the committee specific evidence to show the case a "special" one.

4. All candidates for admission should make some attempt at preaching prior to the time they seek to enter the itinerant ranks.

5. The applicant for admission on trial who is thirty-five years of age or over should without question be thoroughly prepared and possess exceptional fitness for the Methodist ministry.

PROHIBITION AND THE METHODIST CHURCH

Rishop Mouzon read the following, which is published by Conference order:

PROHIBITION AND THE METHODIST CHURCH

During the past few months complaint has repeatedly been made that the Methodist Church has gone into politics. But the situation is exactly the reverse. Politics has unfortunately invaded territory belonging to the church. The church is interested in religion and in morals. This sphere belongs by divine right to the church of Jesus Christ. The church will not approximately been from its rightful field just because the major political question of the hour has to do with morals and religion. For morals and religion cannot be divorced the one from the other. Religion concerns itself with morals both public and private. Religion has to do with human life in all its relations. Christianity is concerned not only in the salvation of individual souls beyond the grave, but in the redemption of human society from the evils that afflict markind in this present world. No evil greater than the liquor traffic has ever afflicted the race. It has always brought in its train poverty, ignorance, lust, and crime.

By all our past history the Methodist Church is committed to the cause of prohibition, and we have no notion of abandoning that cause at the crucial time when prohibition has been made the chief issue in a national campaign.

In order that everyone may see at a glance exactly what the record of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, is; and in order that our own church members may see how Methodism has through the years been committed to the cause of prohibition, I set down here some of the important actions taken by the General Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. It will be understood that the General Conference, which meets every four years, is composed of ministers and laymen in equal numbers representing all the annual conferences of the church and is the one law-making body of the church.

The General Conference meeting in Asheville, North Carolina, in 1910, adopted unanimously the following:

"The Methodist Episcopal Church, South, has ever gone before the world as the unalterable foe of the liquor traffic and is a prohibition church that will never consider a compromise with this heinous sin." (Journal of the Sixteenth General Conference, page 167).

The General Conference meeting in Oklahoma City in 1914 unanimously adopted the following:

"We condemn the liquor traffic as the greatest menace of our day to the welfare of business, society, and the church. We regard it as a public nuisance which must be abated if our civilization is to be saved; we demand that the rights of sober, peaceful, law-abiding citizens be respected and that they be protected from the dangers to property, family, happiness, and life which always accompany the open saloon. We insist that men have no right in the exercise of so-called personal liberty to continue a traffic which infringes ruthlessly, persistently, and destructively upon the rights of others; we declare that the time has come when the protection of the law of the land must be taken from this horrible traffic in the bodies and souls of our children. And the man who insists upon gratifying his greed by the destruction of his neighbors shall be branded as a criminal to be dealt with as all other offenders against the peace and order and uplift of society." (Journal Seventeenth General Conference, p. 325-326).

It will be observed that the above quoted actions were taken before the adoption of the 18th Amendment.

The General Conference meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1918, during the World War, took action insisting that

"Both the manufacture and the sale of intoxicating liquors should be promptly prohibited as a war measure without waiting for the ratification of the constitutional amendment."

And urging as a reason for the adoption of prohibition as a war measure

"The fact that the government, itself, is earnestly and persistently appealing for the conservation of food and fuel and for additional labor for shipyards, munition plants, and farms; practically all business has been suspended for days at a time, schools and colleges and even churches have been closed for lack of fuel; our people have been requested to have heatless days, meatless days, wheatless days, and to eliminate waste in every possible way; and yet the brewers and saloons of the courting have continued to waste foodstuff and fuel and to impair the efficiency of labor in mines, factories, munition plants, and shipyards, so that during the present year while England has reduced her output of beer from 36 million to 12 million barrels and Germany has reduced her output to 7 million barrels, the United State has increased its output to 60 million barrels." (Journal Eighteenth General Conference, p. 277-278).

It will be seen from the above action that during the World War, at a time of national crisis, the liquor business was, as ever, a criminal and a traitor. And, as always, the Methodist Church was in the battle for the destruction of this enemy of mankind.

The General Conference meeting at Hot Springs, Arkansas, in 1922, adopted the following:

"Since the meeting of the last General Conference the Federal Prohibition Amendment has been adopted, forbidding the sale, the importation, the exportation, the transportation of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes in the United States and insular possessions. This amendment became the law of the land on January 16, 1920. By the adoption of this amendment, the partnership of the United States with the traffic in intoxicants was forever dissolved and the traffic became an outlaw. 'Earthly, sensual, devilish,' it still lives. But it lives as the outlaw lives, desperate and defiant. Branded by the law of Christian love as criminal, it is now branded by the law of our country also. We rejoice in the overthrow of this, the giant evil of our modern times. And we especially rejoice that Methodism has, from the beginning of the conflict, led the vanguard of the conquering army. It is an acceptable tribute to our efficient activities that the liquor interests throughout the world denounced Methodism as one of the most potent factors in securing American prohibition. We remember that the beloved disciple said, 'Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you,' and we are pleased to be hated by the enemies of righteousness." (Journal Nineteenth General Conference, page 240).

At the General Conference meeting in Memphis in 1926, the Bishops of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in their address to the General Conference (a message similar to the President's message to Congress) spoke as follows:

"The national prohibition law is the most remarkable social enactment of any great nation to promote the general welfare by the restriction of the activities of the individual. The full effect of such a law will not be secured im-

mediately, or even in a decade. That the results already secured are exceedingly beneficial is evident to any impartial observer, and there is good reason to expect greater benefits in the future. The practical question today is whether the prohibition law shall be nullified or shall be properly enforced. The industrial, social, educational, moral, and religious forces of the nation, led by its Christian citizenship, overthrew the legalized liquor traffic and secured national prohibition. The same great forces must unitedly fight with equal vigor and persistence the outlawed criminal traffic and the would-be nullifiers of the law. Adequate appropriation should be made by state and nation to provide a sufficient number of men with salaries commensurate for such important, dangerous work. Prosecution of offenders should be speedy; penalties by judges and jury should be adequate; violators of the prohibition law, however prominent, should be branded as criminals. Above all, there must continue ever-increasing emphasis upon the educational process in the press, in the pulpit, and in the school, setting forth the evil of alcoholism and the destructive results of lawlessness upon the entire fabric of the national life." (Journal Twentieth General Conference, p. 322).

In harmony with the suggestion of the Bishops in the paragraph quoted above, the General Conference created a Board of Temperance and Social Service charged with the duties of carrying forward in the church and in the nation the work of education along the lines indicated. This board is now actively at work. (See pp. 235 and 237).

The above quotations will show the consistent record of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, during the past 18 years. The public at large may be sure that from this record the Methodist Church will never recede. By this record the church now stands and by this record we shall ever stand.

Let it be reiterated that in sounding a note of alarm, the Methodist Church cannot now be charged with going into politics. At a time of national danger the church and her ministers cannot consent to be silent. The church cannot be silent without betraving a trust. The church could justly be charged with going into politics, if the church, as such, were to unite with some particular political party, or if the church should seek the assistance of some particular party to further its ecclesiastical interests. The Methodist Church seeks no political preferment and desires the aid of no political party. Indeed, at the present time the church, if necessary, stands ready to suffer if only the cause of righteousness shall thereby be advanced. It seeks no political advancement and stands detached entirely from all political parties. But it does stand, as always in the past, committed to moral and religious principles, and from these principles the church will not now be driven. As we have seen from the records of General Conference action quoted in this paper, the Methodist Church through her ministry and her membership did her full share in having the prohibition amendment written into the constitution of the United States. By our own actions we stand. And we rise up now in defense of the constitution of our nation.

So far from forsaking the principles for which Methodism has always stood, we have now begun with renewed energy to fight for those principles. We have begun anew to rally our forces for a persistent and nation-wide campaign which shall make it forever impossible for any considerable group of men to lead in a movement, to acquiesce in a scheme, to lift the ban of outlawry from that arch-criminal, the liquor traffic. We admit that following the adoption of the Eighteenth Amendment, we took too much for granted and became somewhat inactive and lost the spirit of the crusader. But now once more our spirits have been stabbed broad awake. The path of duty lies plain before us, and without turning back, we shall steadily follow it till we reach the desired goal. We call to our side all like-minded men to co-operate in saving America from a return of the liquor business in any form whatsoever.

NEAR EAST RELIEF RESOLUTION

Whereas, our General Conference as well as this conference has for several years heartily endorsed the constructive training program of Near East Relief for thousands of orphans in Bible lands, and, whereas, a number of representatives of our denomination who have traveled in the Near East commend this cause most enthusiastically;

Therefore, be it resolved that we again endorse the Near East Relief Golden Rule program and urge the co-operation and support of our churches, Sunday schools, Epworth Leagues and woman's missionary societies. We especially commend the observance of Golden Rule Sunday.

MRS. G. W. FISHER

A good woman, a leader among us in every good work, went out from us when Mrs. G. W. Fisher quietly breathed her last at the home of her daughter, Mrs. W. D. Finch, in Zebulon at noon Friday, July 22. The shadows had been gathering about her for some months, ever since she left her home in April to visit relatives in Newton—that is, shadows of a physical sort induced by disease. Spiritually there were none. The light in which she had been walking for years was with her during every conscious moment to the last. The last visit her pastor had with her will remain an enduring blessing to him by reason of her shining countenance, her confident testimony and her fervent amen in prayer.

Her maiden name was Ida Love, being born in Caswell County, N. C., March 8, 1866, daughter of James and Ann Love. In 1889 she was married to Rev. George W. Fisher of the North Carolina Conference, who, dying in 1926 while pastor at Garner, preceded her to the glory world.

For 37 years this godly pair walked side by side and worked together for the glory of God in the different charges they served from one side of this conference to the other, in most of them remaining for the full term of four years. She no less than he left each one with an enduring hold on the affections of the people. The great popularity he enjoyed wherever he labored was due in no small measure to the real help that this real helpmeet supplied. That Scripture was fulfilled in her case which says, "The heart of her husband did safely trust in her. She did him good and not evil all the days of her life." As her Master, she went about doing good and her idea of doing good was not confined to the prayer meeting, the Sunday school, the missionary society, the churchto each of which she gave regular attendance scarcely less regular than that of the pastor himself, and all of which she supported liberally with her purse. All of these she did, but they were no substitute with her for work of another sort, viz.: her personal presence in homes and at times when such presence meant something and her personal word to those with whom such word was more effective than a sermon. It was true of her that her meat was ever to do the will of Him that sent her. Thus it comes about that in every charge where they labored together for these 37 years her tracks are no less discernible today than those of the godly man by whose side she walked. Bereft of his companionship and going no longer with him over the conference as she had done for so many years at the voice of the Bishop, Sister Fisher lost no whit of her interest in the work of the church. The new preacher was her pastor from the reading of the appointment. She lost no time in telling him so or inviting him to her home.

She lived her life well and beautifully. In the church it was that way and in the community. More so if possible was it that way in the home—largely her making. Few preachers' homes among us with their breaking up have ever left better, more convincing evidence of the quality of the lives there spent than the one made and presided over by George W. Fisher and his wife, Ida Lee Fisher. Eight children were born to them. Five of them survive, all of them members of the church in which they spent their lives, viz.: Clyde Olin Fisher, professor of economics, Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn.; Dr. Ralph Lee Fisher, Standish, Mich.; Henry E. Fisher, attorney at law, Charlotte; Rev. Edgar B. Fisher, assistant pastor First M. E. Church, South, Rocky Mount; and Mrs. W. D. Finch, Zebulon.

MRS. FRANCINA CLARKE UNDERWOOD

Francina Clarke Underwood, daughter of Francis and Sarah Ingram Clarke, was born in Anson County, near Ansonville, N. C., December 25, 1856. She passed to her reward at the home of her daughter, Mrs. J. A. Worrell, Rich Square, N. C., on the morning of March 7, 1928.

Sister Underwood professed faith in Christ in early childhood and joined the Concord M. E. Church, South, in Anson County. She was an accomplished and talented woman, graduating at Mecklenburg Female College, Boydton, Va., with an A.B. degree in French Literature and Music. In this field she was later very proficient and useful.

Her first marriage was to R. A. Lintz, who died in early manhood.

She was again happily married, in 1890, to Rev. J. E. Underwood, who for many years was an honored and useful member of the North Carolina Conference. To this union there were born three children, one son and two daughters, namely: Mrs. Fannie Belle Worrell, Rich Square, N. C.; J. E. Underwood, Jr., Rich Square, N. The funeral service was conducted from the Methodist Church at Rich Square, N. C., by the writer, together with the assistance of Rev. B. C. Thompson, Jackson, N. C., and Rev. Rufus Bradley, LaGrange, N. C. Her body was laid to rest in the local cemetery.

Sister Underwood possessed many traits that most graciously fitted her for the tasks of the Kingdom. She was wonderfully endowed with natural capacities, her intellect was keen and her soul large and sympathetic. She was exact in her walk, gentle and patient in spirit. She had a profound love for the church and God's people. She took her rightful place as leader in the various organizations of the church. Her influence was most felt in the woman's missionary work. She was at one time our conference missionary president. No sermon in her presence could be poor, but to her it was an opportunity to worship God.

Hers was an ever increasing life. Her interest in the community and church grew to the end, but her greatest contribution and supreme sacrifice was made in the home. Being the wife of a Methodist preacher for thirty-five years, the place of her home was named by the conference, but the basis of her home life was the breath of her own soul. She was a loving and devoted wife, always an inspiration to her husband. It was she who silently prayed and worked for the success of his ministry. It was her love, her sacrifices and unselfish devotion that enabled him to make so great a contribution as an humble servant of the Lord. Her greatest concern was her home. FRANCIS BRAGG McCALL

Francis Bragg McCall, son of Hugh and Sarah McCall, was born in what is now Scotland County, N. C., February 26, 1858. His mother, a noble Christian woman, taught him to love and reverence the church. When he was but a little lad she would take a lunch, for it was four miles to their church, St. John's, and she and the boy would walk to church. The effect of such training was manifest. Out of that home went three into the itinerancy: the subject of this memoir, his younger brother, John Calton McCall, poet, preacher and saint, and his sister, Mrs. J. A. Hornaday.

Early in life Brother McCall joined St. John Church, as a seeker under the ministry of Rev. T. W. Guthrie. When later he was soundly converted a call to preach came with the conversion. A clipping from the "Pee Dee" of March, 1879, says: "At the last quarterly conference of the Laurinburg Circuit, M. E. Church, South, license was granted to preach the gospel to Mr. F. B. McCall, son of Hugh McCall, Esq. We are pleased to hear that he acquitted himself very creditably in his examination. He is talented, well informed, and bright, and with the budding promise of hope starts out with the prospect of doing good." He joined the North Carolina Conference at its session in Wilson that fall.

He received the following appointments: 1879, Onslow Circuit; 1880, Columbia Circuit; 1881, Pamlico Circuit; 1882, Straits Mission; 1883-84, Monroe Circuit; 1885-87, Clear Creek Circuit; 1888-89, Bladen Circuit; 1890-92, Lumberton Circuit; 1893-94, Tar River Circuit; 1895-98, Gates Circuit; 1899, Fremont Circuit; 1900-03, Carr Church and Branson; 1904-06, St. Johns and Gibson; 1907, Roper Circuit; 1908-10, Rowland Circuit; 1911-12, Laurel Hill Circuit; 1913, Snow Hill Circuit; 1914-15, Mt. Olive Circuit; 1916, Scotland Neck; 1917-18, Bertie Circuit; 1919-20, Fairfield. While I had known Brother McCall all my ministry and had had for him an ever deepening admiration, I learned to know and love him afresh during the two years in Fairfield when I was his presiding elder. At the end of his second year there, at his request, I very reluctantly moved his superannuation. After a year of rest he again entered the active work as preacher in charge of the Lumberton Circuit. But this trial convinced him that he must give up the effort. The remainder of his life was spent in the home of his daughter, Mrs. Usher, at Laurel Hill. In these last years he occupied himself with home duties, spent much time with his beloved books, and was happy, except that he yearned ever for the privilege of proclaiming the glorious gospel of the blessed God.

Brother McCall was twice married. April 24, 1877, he married Miss Fannie Simons of Anson County, who died the next year when her son, Eugene Calton McCall, was only three weeks old. March 16, 1881, he married Miss Ella Bell of Onslow County. After an ideal union of more than forty-seven years, in which she was to him all that a companion, helper and friend could be, she survives. To this union were born three boys and six girls. The son of the first wife, Eugene C. McCall, and five of these daughters still live: Mrs. R. B. Mullen of Warrenton; Mrs. B. F. McColman of Faison; Mrs. Nina Lipscomb and Mrs. Lula Usher of Laurel Hill, and the youngest, Mrs. F. E. Tomlin of Sochow, China.

His summons came suddenly and unexpectedly. The afternoon of April 12, 1928, the family went for a little rest, leaving him lying on the davenport in the sitting room. They heard no sound, but when they came down found him lying dead near the back porch. There was no sign of struggle. He probably went for a drink of water, and in a moment, without pain, passed from life here to life eternal. They laid him to rest at Gibson, the service being conducted by Rev. J. B. Thompson, assisted by E. H. McWhorter, H. C. Ewing, O. W. Dowd, J. G. Johnson, W. C. Merritt, W. J. DuBois, T. G. Vickers, R. F. Munns, and L. E. Sawyer, and Rev. A. J. McKilway of the Presbyterian Church. A large concourse gathered to do him honor.

Who can rightly estimate such a life of service? F. B. McCall was not called to fill high places nor to do spectacular deeds. Many of us who were in much, his inferiors, passed him by in preferment. But he did not grow sour. He was modest and self-effacing to a fault. Simply, humbly, patiently, he went about his work; with zeal and earnestness proclaiming his Master by words of loving wisdom, and with even greater eloquence, preaching him by his life. Others saw his good works and glorified his Father.

The harmonious estimate in which he was held by his brethren may well be illustrated by the tribute borne by some who knew him best. The North Carolina Christian Advocate said of him: "There was never a more faithful and conscientious itinerant preacher. He lived in all good conscience before God and man. Eternity alone will reveal the full result of his labors. Rev. F. B. McCall preached well; few could equal him in a prayer meeting talk. He spoke with such conciseness and spiritual intuition that his message went to the heart. At times his quaint Scotch humor would prove a pleasant surprise—an impressive turn."

From Brother L. E. Thompson, who was once his elder, now himself in age and feebleness extreme, comes this expressive word, "He was a mighty good man. He believed in the old time religion and set the example." Dr. Gibbs, also his presiding elder, once said, "His very trueness gave him influence beyond the ordinary. He was a good gospel preacher, orthodox in the theology of his church and untroubled by science and philosophy, falsely so-called. He preached repentance and faith in Christ and often had good revivals. He lived what he preached and was listened to as one who had been with Christ. His home life was simple and beautiful. He loved his family and his wife and children were truly devoted to him. Taken all in all, Brother McCall was one of our truest and best men." While from Rev. A. McCullen, who knew him long and intimately, comes this well deserved tribute: "Brother F. B. McCall, whom I knew for over forty-five years, was, in my opinion, of the highest type of Christian manhood. He was faithful, pure and true. He left the odor of a good name wherever he served. I do not think that he had an enemy in the world. He was a quiet, gentle, lovable spirit. His love for Jesus Christ was supreme. He laid all upon the altar of God. He was a safe preacher, earnest and fully consecrated. The Bible was God's Word to him. When he left us to go up on high, the church lost one of its noblemen."

All who knew him and to the degree that they knew him will confirm these testimonics. Gentle but strong, uncompromising but humble, retiring and self-effacing yet zealous for his Lord and tender to his people, he wrought in our conference for more than forty-eight years. To him, without reservation, one may apply the words of the great Apostle to the Gentiles: "He fought a good fight. He has finished his course. He has kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for him a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give unto him at that day."

GEORGE BASCOM PERRY

This faithful itinerant was born in Chatham County August 7, 1851, and laid down his armor in Princeton, North Carolina, August 7, 1928, his seventy-seventh birthday.

Right vigorous he looked that morning and the smile was still on his face when he slipped away soon after the breakfast hour.

He went as a good soldier would like to go. There were no weary days of suffering, no long waiting for the chariot. When he was full dressed and just starting the work of another day God called him home.

Those who knew him needed no assurance of farewell words that it was well with him.

The funeral was held from the Methodist Church in Princeton, conducted by Revs. J. H. Shore, S. A. Cotton and the writer. Something like a score of Methodist preachers joined the membership of the Princeton charge and other friends to pay tribute to his memory. He was buried in the cemetery at Smithfield with Rev. D. E. Earnhardt and Rev. A. S. Barnes reading the church service.

On August 13, 1873, Brother Perry was married to Miss Josephine Pugh, of Chatham County, who survives him. The living children are: Mrs. Mozelle Perry Allen, Durham, N. C.; G. Marvin Perry, Louisburg, N. C.; A. Olin Perry, Franklinton, N. C.; Mrs. Mamie Davis, Burlington, N. C.; Mrs. Jennie Moore, Bennettsville, S. C.; Mrs. Josie Highsmith, Duan, N. C.; Mrs. Rena Blackburn, Selma, N. C.; and Mrs. Laura Mauney, Cherryville, N. C. The youngest son, Carl Pugh Perry, died in his twenty-first year.

Brother Perry's record as a Methodist itinerant reads as follows: Joining the North Carolina Conference in 1885, he served that year at Smithfield; Uwharrie, 1886-87; Rutherfordton, 1888; Uwharrie, 1889-90; Mt. Gilead, 1891-93; Northampton, 1894; Oxford, 1895-97; Franklinton, 1898-1901; Burlington, 1902; Gibson, 1903-04; Littleton, 1905-08; Snow Hill, 1909-11; Zebulon, 1912-14; Roper, 1915; Bailey, 1916-18; Kittrell, 1919-20; Selma, 1921-23; Princeton, 1924-28. Thus from the Catawba to the Roanoke, at one time among the hills and mountains, and then on the plains of the east he went forth to preach the "glorious gospel of the blessed God."

He did not seek what men call the high places. He began his ministry in those days when it was considered a privilege to be an ambassador of Jesus Christ in any place. For the most part he preached to the countryside, whence comes the backbone of our Methodism and where the most of our preachers receive their call to the ministry.

Our friend delivered a simple gospel message in a plain, direct, practical way. He felt that it was his mission to tell the people of the Christ who had redeemed him from sin—planted his feet on the rock and put a new song in his mouth. He left it to others to wander in the bypaths, to indulge the embellishments of speech, to proclaim earthly philosophies. That was not his task. This man stood under the cross and cried to the congregation, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ." What he accomplished during these forty-three years of his ministry only the records of Eternity can tell.

The Christian religion made George Bascom Perry every inch a man. His speech was clean, his life well ordered, his faith adamant. In the home he was all that could have been asked of a husband and father; in the church he was faithful to his trust and walked worthy of his high calling; in the community he stood always for the best things.

It was my privilege to enjoy his friendship for well nigh his entire ministerial life and I feel safe in saying that no unclean word ever passed his lips and that no questionable transaction ever marred his record. That commission entrusted to him forty-three years ago he handed back to the church unstained, and he left to his loved ones and friends a good name which is "rather to be chosen than great riches."

This was one man who will be missed at our conference. His manners were the manners of the Christian gentleman and there was something about him which he did not find in any school of this earth. A genial, attractive soul, it was a delight to meet with him at these annual gatherings and talk over the doings of the year.

But he has left us to answer that other roll call. Thus runs the story of the itinerant preacher's life. He tarries here for a little while to "sing the great Redeemer's praise" and then goes on to take up the new task.

May Heaven shelter this home and keep us all until we reach that place "where beyond these voices there is peace."

GEORGE FRANKLIN SMITH

George Franklin Smith, son of Alfred and Martha Lenier Smith, was born at Jackson Hill in Davidson County, N. C., August 8, 1861, and died at Littleton, N. C., December 2, 1927.

He was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, in his early youth. He received his education at Rutherford, Trinity College and Vanderbilt University.

He was happily married to Miss Lena M. Nelson, of Beaufort, N. C., June 3rd, 1890. To this union there were born the following children: Dr. Frank C., Jeraldean, Mary, and Martha Tilghman, all of whom with his wife are still living.

He served the following appointments: Centenary, Greensboro, 1887-89; Beaufort, 1890-91; Greenville, 1892-95; Louisburg, 1896-99; Raleigh, Edenton Street, 1900-03; Warrenton District, 1904-06; Fayetteville, Hay Street, 1907-08; Wilson, 1909-11; Durham, Memorial, 1912-13; Elizabeth City, First Church, 1914-15; Rockingham, 1916-18; Louisburg, 1919-22; Littleton, 1923-27. Here at the end of his fifth year his health was so broken that he was superannuated.

For forty-one years he had been a splendid exponent of the Gospel both in the pulpit and in his social and business contacts with men.

He was a successful preacher. It was his privilege and joy to lead many souls to Christ during his eventful life. He was indeed a winner of souls and his influence lives on in the life of many whom he induced to make the great decision.

As a pastor he had few equals. He loved that part of his work and he knew how to make it effective in the life of his people. A man of deep piety and a keen sense of responsibility, he literally went from house to house in obedience to the impulse of love for mankind. He knew human nature. He knew how to be all things to all men to the end that he might save some.

He was peculiarly strong in times when his people were in trouble. And they turned to him as to a brother or father for they believed in his sincerity and his godly life.

He looked well after the details of his work. Every interest of the church was safe in his hands. He preached forty-one years and never once reported a deficit in his collections. This is a record that is very unusual.

His sunny disposition drew men to him. He was an optimist. He never entertained the idea that every thing was wrong with the world. He never believed that men were altogether bad, and he was always looking for the good in men, and always ready to hope for the best. He never indulged in harsh criticisms of his brethren but was always ready to overlook their faults and hope that the good that was in them would prevail.

He was a general favorite with his brethren both ministerial and lay. He numbered his friends by the thousand in North Carolina. And it might truthfully be said of him that he was the friend of everybody.

As a husband and father he was a model; always kind and tender; always an example in thoughtfulness and devotion.

A rare spirit has gone from us and we shall miss him. In his last hours his childhood home was much in his thoughts. He often spoke of the scenes of his early days. It is fitting that his ashes should rest in the soil of his native hills. May we all meet him in the dawn of the eternal day!

May God's peace abide in the hearts of his loved ones!

JULIAN LEE CRAFT RUMLEY

Julian Lee Craft Rumley, son of Denard and Mary Perry Rumley, was born in the town of Beaufort, N. C., June 14, 1870, and died in Farmville, N. C., February 1, 1928.

Brother Rumley faithfully served the church in the following charges: Littleton, 1893; Plymouth, 1894-95; Hertford, 1896; Edenton, 1897; Murfreesboro, 1898-99; Plymouth, 1900; Oriental, 1901-02; Wilson Circuit, 1903; Robersonville, 1904; Elm City, 1905-06; Fairfield, 1907-10; Nashville, 1911-14; Fremont, 1915-18; Farmville, 1919-22; Maxton, 1923-24.

At the end of this year he took the superannuate relation and, at the invitation of many warm friends, took up his residence in Farmville where he was the recipient of many kindnesses. But for a serious physical breakdown in his early ministry, this gifted son of Methodism would, doubtless, have filled many of our leading appointments. But in spite of delicate health he gave to the church a genuine service the influence of which will abide.

Brother Rumley was a gifted speaker and a fine sermonizer. He possessed all the elements that go to make an attractive and effective preacher. He reasoned well; he was well grounded in the Bible; he was deeply spiritual; he was a man of warm sympathies; thoroughly in love with God and men and deeply consecrated to his work.

As a pastor he was faithful and diligent, kind and thoughtful. He knew how to comfort the distressed and how to point them to the source of peace.

We shall miss his brotherly greetings at our annual gatherings, but we know he rests from his labors and is forever with the King.

A devoted wife, four sons and one daughter survive. May the Holy Spirit comfort and sustain them!

SAUL ERASTUS MERCER

Saul Erastus Mercer, son of Miles V. and Elizabeth (Russ) Mercer, was born at Howardsville, N. C., April 2, 1867, and died in Lumberton Hospital July 25, 1928.

He and members of his family had been to Beaufort for an outing and while on their way to the old home in Robeson County to a family reunion he was stricken ill and was hurried to the hospital where, after a few days of suffering, he died.

Brother Mercer was converted in early life and united with the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. He was educated at Trinity College. Soon after his graduation from that institution he entered the work of the ministry. He joined the North Carolina Conference at its session in Raleigh in 1897. He was ordained Deacon in 1899; he was ordained Elder in 1903. He served the following charges: Sneads Grove Circuit, 1897-1900; Richmond Circuit, 1901-02; Red Springs Circuit, 1903-05; Agent for Carolina Institute, 1906; Clinton Circuit, 1907; Weldon Station, 1908-10; Maxton, 1911-12; President Carolina College, 1913-15; Central Church, Raleigh, 1916; Burlington, 1917-18; Calvary, Durham, 1919-20; Presiding Elder Weldon District, 1921-24; Presiding Elder Washington District, 1925 to the time of his death.

A casual glance at these appointments will show that our brother touched the life of the church at many points. He knew by experience the hardships of the itinerant's life and he knew the responsibilities of the man in difficult situations.

Whether as pastor, college president or presiding elder, S. E. Mercer gave to the work of the church an unfaltering allegiance and devoted service. Possessed of a strong mind, a commanding personality and an iron will, he ranked as one of the leaders of his conference as well as one of the substantial citizens of the state.

As a preacher he was simple and direct. There was always the evidence of sincerity. He relied on the truth rather than on the arts of the speaker. His soul loathed affectation and cant. He believed the gospel was the power of God unto salvation and that it was the only remedy for the social and moral ills of man.

As an executive he was strong. He had a genius for organization and the ability to secure the co-operation of others. Men loved to work with him because his hard sense and fine judgment inspired confidence in his leadership. He loved his brethren and demonstrated that love in all his relations with them. He was peculiarly thoughtful of the young men and they gave him their confidence and devotion in return.

Brother Mercer was chosen as a member of our last General Conference which met in Memphis, Tenn. There, as elsewhere, he proved his worth by fidelity to the duties imposed on him by his conference.

Brother Mercer was twice married. The first marriage was on September 25, 1900. His bride was Ethel Waldo Thompson, daughter of Rev. J. E. Thompson, for many years an honored member of this conference. Sister Mercer was a most capable and devoted wife and added much to the ministry of her husband until her health failed her. She was an invalid for fourteen years, much of the time helpless. She entered into rest December 5, 1924. In 1890 North Carolina territory in the Holston Conference and in the Virginia Conference, except that beyond the Chowan River, was transferred to the North Carolina Conference, and the Conference was divided into the North Carolina and Western North Carolina Conferences. In 1894 the remaining North Carolina territory in the Virginia Conference was transferred to the North Carolina Conference.


