Special events (such as fellowship occasions, missionary or guest speakers): We were hosts at three area meetings: the Durham District "Quiet Day Apart" in October, with Philip Cartwright, interpreter of sacred music, as leader; the District Study Course (Jurisdictional) on "The Christian Mission on the Rim of Southeast Asia," taught by Dr. Creighton Lacy, in October; and in March the World Day of Prayer observance by the churches of Durham. Four Circles held meetings at the Retirement Home, with special programs for the residents of the Home and the Circle members. Danny Arichaea, a Crusade Scholar from the Philippines, spoke to us of our work there. A joint meeting was held with the Guild at Christmas,--with a Christmas program presented by the choir. Our members were told of "Project Nicaragua" by Miss Gloria Stevens. One of our Circles is having for its monthly programs, a serious and detailed study on "Church History." Gen. J. W. Holsinger, Retired, spoke to us on "The Christian American Soldier." "The Church and Today's Student" was the subject of a discussion by the Rev. Jackson Carroll, Methodist Chaplain at Duke University.
