Pastor's Report
First Quarterly Conference
November 6, 1963

Many significant items make up this report of the Pastor to this Quarterly Conference. Since our Fourth Quarterly Conference was held on April 9, 1963 seven months have passed since that Conference.

At our Annual Conference in Greenville in June we were able to report all Conference obligations paid in full. A total amount of \$104,636 was reported as having been raised for all purposes. We had received 77 new members during the year but had lost 82 by transfer and death leaving a membership as of June 16 of 1954 members. Twenty infants were baptized during the year and three adults.

Since the last Quarterly Conference 73 persons have been received into the church and 42 have been lost by transfer and death. Nine infants have been baptized. On June 21, 1963 a special session of the Quarterly Conference was held to hear the report of the Building Committee as to bids for the new building. The Conference approved the bids as presented and authorized the signing of contracts. A committee was named to make plans for the ground-breaking ceremony, and this ceremony was held on July 14. Work began on the new building the following day, and construction has proceeded at a satisfactory pace. The service for the laying of the cornerstone was held on October 13, 1963.

While we have been greatly interested in the Building project, we have also been concerned about the total program of the church, and leaders in all phases of our church's program have been carrying on their work in an effective manner. We are all concerned that when we can actually occupy our new facilities our whole program will be moving in such a way that we can immediately make the most of these facilities.

VI. CONNECTIONAL PROGRAMS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. *District Programs*—participation in district rallies, subdistrict meetings, summer camps and institutes, financial requests.
2. *Annual Conference Programs*—participation in Annual Conference rallies, financial apportionments, support of colleges and Wesley Foundations, programs of evangelism, Annual Conference Specials, and development programs.
3. *Area, Jurisdictional, and General Conference Programs and Financial Requests*—apportionments and participation.

Promotion and Rally Day was observed with a service of installation and dedication for Church School teachers and for members of the Official Board. World Wide Communion Sunday was observed with an offering for the Fellowship of Suffering and Service. A choir recognition service was held on October 27 for the five choirs of our church. The observance of a special Sunday in recognition of the Woman's Society of Christian Service will be held on November 17. Plans are now under way for a meaningful Christmas observance.

We feel that satisfactory progress is being made in all our work, but we are ever conscious of the need of serving God better in all our work. We are grateful to him for the leading of His Spirit in all that we do, and pray that this Spirit will continue to guide and strengthen us.
