
Report of Pastor



- (A) Preached 40 times during year. Taught Church School classes 6 times. Church has sponsored special Advent/Lenten study and worship experiences.
- (B) The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been offered once a month at 9:15 a.m. on Sunday morning with the exception of Communion at 11:00. We celebrated the Lord's Supper three times at 11:00 on Sundays, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Eve. The Sacrament of Holy Baptism was administered to 14 persons during the year.
- (C) A great deal of time is being spent in organizing neighborhood groups, work areas, short term special groups (choirs, interest groups, etc.). Our Terrific Tuesday program is a great success - attendance continues between 125 - 150 persons per week.
- (1) A membership class was held in the Spring taught by R. B. Haverly. I worked with the five adult/older youth received on Profession of Faith. We will have a healthy membership increase this year for the first time in several years.
- (2) I represented the Conference at an urban ministries Conference at Pfeiffer College, work with District Committee on ministries, District Council on Ministries, Conference Board of Ministry - serve on two sub-committees, plus committee on Continuing Education. Would like to be considered for one of the Trustee positions at one of Conference Institutions. Attended Bishop's Seminar on preaching, and Duke Convocation, Prayer Conference at Junaluska, Seminar for Ministers of larger churches in Southeastern Jurisdiction. Also, attended January workshop.
- (3) We use Methodist Literature. We are constantly evaluating and working to improve the total Educational program of the church. Terrific Tuesdays and special interest classes have aided a great deal in giving a model for new educational opportunities.
- (4) Have performed six wedding ceremonies during year with two counselling sessions each.
- (5) Have participated in 22 funerals during year.

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- (6) We are constantly following up reports on persons needing help.
- (7) Our staff visits the hospital three days a week regularly and at any time during emergencies. Regular visitation is carried on through Cliff Visitation Committee, ministers, ministers-in-residence, and lay people.
- (d) I attend Durham Ministerial Assocation, Durham Churches In Action, plus am working to engage neighboring churches in worship and service opportunities. Duke Memorial is greatly involved in the new Urban Ministry. We gave the second largest amount of any church in town and had the most individual pledges.
- (e) Robert Skinner has decided this year to enter the Methodist Ministry. He is enrolled at Duke Divinity School.
- (f) In the past year the Council on Ministries has been organized with five of eight Work Areas functioning. Members are now secured for three year terms. The Charge Conference will elect all major committees this year. We feel the organizational structure is functioning as it should. Each year we will continue to refine the st qu ma
