


A program which has built or repaired over 125 churches, allocated 15 vehicles and 60 motorcycles, trained over 1,000 clergy and lay persons, and spread the Gospel and encouraged church growth in 10 African nations.

US churches are enabled to share in the work of overseas churches by supporting their national workers through this program. As many as 10 nationals can be empowered for the same funds we might use to send one US missionary overseas.

PARTNER CHURCHES IN CRISIS No. 010068-0
A program which helps colleague churches around the world to provide emergency salary support or food supplements for church workers, to provide institutional necessities and to undergird the structure of the church for long term stability.

Bolivia is the poorest country in South America. Preventive medicine is the country's main need. Deaths are caused frequently by bacteria now nonexistent here, as well as malnutrition and dehydration.

Andean Rural Health Care has been able to bring hope and primary health care to 20,000 people in Bolivia who would not otherwise have had any care. They have been able to vaccinate more than 2,000 children; teach mothers about nutrition, rehydration formula, and breast feeding; treat people with illnesses, and refer critical cases to hospitals.

Eleanor Powell, a member of First United Methodist Church in Clinton, and John Wesley Jones, a member of Haymount United Methodist Church in Fayetteville, are members of the Board of Directors. Both have worked for several weeks in the program there and are very knowledgeable about the ministry.



in 47 states and the District of Columbia. At a total cost of less than 4¢ a pound, nutritious produce (that is normally

dumped to rot), is salvaged and distributed to food banks, Native American Reservations, and other agencies working to feed the poor and hungry. Expansion of the Potato Project is currently limited only by available finances.

The newest program, the Virginia Gleaning Network, officially started in late May. The Gleaning Network has gleaned a total of 103,000 pounds of otherwise wasted produce from farms within the Commonwealth, Maryland and D.C.

This project, an affiliate of Habitat For Humanity International, helps communities help themselves. Housing for needy families is constructed/renovated using primarily volunteer labor and donated materials. Low-cost housing enables families to direct more of their limited financial resources to meeting other basic needs such as food and health care. (This was chosen to coordinate with 1990 mission study.)

N.C. UNITED METHODIST MIGRANT MINISTRIES_ Special Emphasis

This is a ministry to migrant workers in North Carolina and their families, helping to meet educational needs and emergency needs.

YOKEFELLOW PRISON MINISTRIES -- Offering a ministry of friendship and hope to those in prison through one-on-one relationships between volunteers and inmates.

FOOD BANK OF NORTH CAROLINA -- An ecumenical hunger project which receives and distributes surplus food.

ISA GRANT SCHOLARSHIP FUND -- A fund which provides volunteer workteam scholarships to persons who could not otherwise participate in a workteam experience.

CONFERENCE MISSION WORKTEAMS -- Provides help for short-term volunteers on workteams in the USA or overseas.
