#### Mission and Outreach Opportunities

There are many opportunities to find your "joy in mission" at Duke Memorial. Become a valuable part of mission work both here in Durham and around the world. The following list describes some opportunities available to you and who to contact if you're interested:

Africa University: A Methodist-supported university located in Zimbabwe, Africa. Currently the schools of Theology and Agriculture are operating with plans for expansion into education, business and medicine. Financial and material support is needed. Contact Omar Fink: 477-6209.

Alternative Gift Program: An opportunity to purchase items for various mission programs as an alternative gift item. Offered every year during Advent (in time for Christmas shopping!). Gifts include items for Heifer Project, Peru Covenant, Habitat and West End. Others may be added in the future. Contact Donna Elium: 382-8228.

Andean Rural Health Care Program: An arrangement with the Bolivian Methodist Church to provide vaccinations, nutritional monitoring of children, prenatal care and other preventative health care services to people in need in Bolivia. Contact Donna Elium: 382-8228.

Bread for the World: Educates and influences people to work for government policies that address the basic causes of domestic and world hunger. Contact Dan Guth: 471-9880.

Community Shelter for H.O.P.E.: Offers short-term housing for people who are homeless in the Durham area. A Covenant Disciple group from Duke Memorial serves a meal the 4th Friday every other month. There are opportunities for other groups to serve meals on a regular basis. Contact Ann Williams: 682-2409.

CROP Walk: An annual spring event which raises money for overseas development work and local hunger assistance programs. You can participate by walking or sponsoring a walker. Contact Dan Guth: 471-9880.

**Durham Congregations in Action (DCIA)**: Approximately 50 member congregations fund and oversee the work of a number of outreach and helping ministries throughout the Durham area. Duke Memorial houses the DCIA office. You can help represent Duke Memorial at periodic meetings. Contact Caroline and Louis Sasser: 489-4203.

**Durham Inter-Faith AIDS Ministry**: Volunteers provide non-medical assistance to AIDS patients and their families as a member of a care team. Training sessions are held periodically. Contact Sue Clifton: 493-3756 or Kathy Fitzsimmons: 471-9880.

**Durham Mission Society**: Located downtown in the Urban Ministries Center. Includes a food pantry and a clothes closet. You can participate by volunteering on the 3rd Tuesday of each month or by donating food on the first Sunday of each month. Watch Insights to find out what kind of food is needed and leave it on the altar at the Sunday service. Good used clothing can be deposited by the front entrance to the Education building. Habitat for Humanity: A cooperative community effort to provide affordable housing. You can participate by volunteering with construction projects or supporting Duke Memorial's fund-raising projects. Contact Tom Adkinson: 383-1167.

Missionaries: Duke Memorial sponsors the following missionaries: Bob and Hazel Terhune (Japan), Herbert and Mary Zigbuo (Liberia), and Lynn and Sharon Fogleman (Kenya). You can further support these persons through financial offerings and much-appreciated correspondence. Contact Donna Elium: 382-8228.

OBRAS DE WESLEY: A new mission project to produce a 14 volume Spanish edition of the Works of Wesley. Duke Memorial is a sponsor of the cost of preparing the Spanish text of one volume (budgeted for 1995-96). Through this long-neglected, urgent ministry we are sending missionary John Wesley to Spanish-speaking people in the US and throughout Latin America. Contact Elbert Wethington: 382-2544.

**Peru Covenant**: Church members in Peru have requested ongoing communication with church members in NC. Help is needed with programming ideas and supplies. Duke Memorial hopes to sponsor a work team to Peru in 1995 or 96. Contact Para Drake: 490-1363 or Mark Wethington: 683-3467.

**Results**: Non-profit citizen advocacy organization which lobbies on behalf of people in need. Participation in this group can offer you information and practical advice on what you can do to fight world hunger. Contact Dan Guth: 471-9880.

SHARE: A self help and resource exchange program which provides value in grocery purchases in exchange for participation in community service. Duke Memorial serves as a site of registration (once a month) and distribution of food packages (once a month). Society of St. Andrew (SOSA): A non-profit, church-supported hunger relief organization with offices in VA and NC. Locally, SOSA sponsors a Gleaning Network, which involves volunteers in the salvage of crops left in fields for distribution to people in need. SOSA office is located in Duke Memorial basement. You can help glean, serve as a field leader, drive Duke Memorial's van to transport people to fields, help pick up produce, or attend a gleaning/hunger study retreat. Volunteers in Mission: An agency of the United Methodist Church that provides opportunities for lay members and clergy to become involved in the mission effort of the church on a short-term volunteer basis in the U.S. and abroad. Involvement is hands-on work in projects ranging from evangelistic efforts to construction of needed facilities, to providing administrative or training assistance. Duke Memorial has helped send work teams to Bolivia, Peru and Belize. Contact Donna Elium: 382-8228.

West End Neighborhood: In 1992 members of Duke Memorial became involved in the West End community by helping to renovate a house now being used as a community center. You can help by volunteering your time as a tutor after school and during the summer or donating supplies. Contact the church office 683-3467.

Youth Mission: The senior high youth, or Joy Class, are involved in a mission trip every other year. In the past, the youth have gone to Alabama, Oklahoma and Alaska. You can help by supporting youth fund-raising events or accompanying them on their mission trips. Contact Joy class leaders.
