Music Activities

God's people have historically sung their praise and thanksgiving to God. At Duke Memorial, we offer many opportunities for people to express their faith through music. We encourage you to dedicate and develop your talent and to serve God through our ministry of music.

Carol Choir (Kdg. - 2nd grade) The Carol Choir strives to involve each child in all aspects of music and worship. Singing, listening, rhythmic skills, and music reading are learned through DOING. Our music curriculum utilizes special activities, games, and movement. The Carol Choir meets on Wednesdays 6:15 - 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary Choir Room.

Wesley Singers (3rd - 8th grade) This choir fully implements the music fundamentals learned in Carol Choir. They sing monthly in worship and study hymnody and worship as well as music education. The Wesley Singers meet on Wednesdays 6:15 - 7:15 p.m. in the Open Door Room.

Celebration Singers (Adult) This group specializes in the music of many differing styles. It offers people an opportunity to sing monthly in worship and remain with their families during the service. We rehearse in the Open Door Room 7:30 - 8:30 p.m. on the second Tuesday of each month. We meet at 9:15 a.m. the following Sunday in the Sanctuary to prepare to sing in worship. Musical expertise is not expected, only the desire to praise God through song.

Sanctuary Choir (Adult) This is the primary singing ensemble in the church. It leads worship each week. It also presents several special musical services throughout the year. While always striving for excellence, this is a volunteer organization and new members are welcomed. It meets on Thursdays 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. in the Choir Room.

Bethany Bells (Adult) This group meets on Wednesdays 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. in the Handbell Room. We participate in worship every 4 - 6 weeks and also participate in area handbell festivals.

Liturgical Dance (Adult, Youth, & Children) Our liturgical dancers bring a meaningful visual impact to worship by combining sacred dance with voice and music. God is the choreographer of life.
