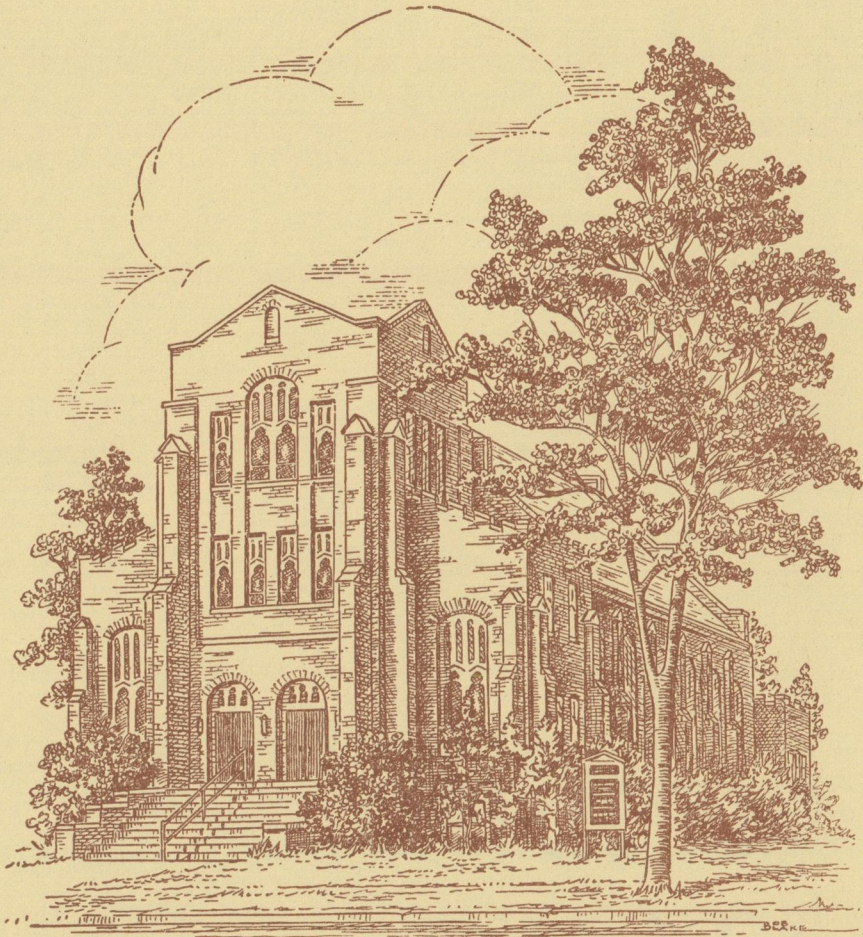

On October 31, 1517, a young Augustinian monk named Martin
Luther posted on the doors of the Castle Church in Wittenburg,
Germany, ninety-five theses or arguments against the sale of
indulgences by the Church of his day. This incident touched
off a long train of events which produced the historic move-
ment known as the Reformation. The anniversary of this event
is observed among the Protestant Churches as a time of emphasis
upon their fundamental Christian convictions.
