Dear Albert,

Your work has been mentioned with great appreciation a number of times in these lectures at This Theology Institute (program enclosed). Father Geo. Favard has especially spoken of your contribution on the relation of scripture to tradition with profound gratitude. I am the only Protestant present with these 120 young priests, who seem quite eager to get in touch with current Protestant Theology. This has been a very moving experience for me. I find that I have as much in common with the younger R.C. priests than either of us have with the older clergy of a generation or two ago. I have enjoyed long conversations with Father Haring and found him extremely perceptive.

After two years delay, my essay on The use of analogia fidei in the rapprochement of Theology and psychotherapy has finally appeared in the summer issue of Continuum.
