Dear sir,

I have been trying to teach ministers something <sup>the nature of</sup> about political responsibility here in Texas for the last two years. Now I am moving to Oklahoma, and would like to enlist your aid in continuing this task.

I have been teaching Christian Ethics at Perkins School of Theology, and have been peripherally involved in some of the complex political issues in this area. This fall I am assuming a new teaching position at the Graduate Seminary at Phillips University. It will again be my responsibility to teach young ministers how to make the Christian message relevant to the political realities of the Twentieth Century. I hope you share with me an urgent concern to do this. If so, I would look forward to having conversations with you about the predicament our nation is in, and what responsible party leaders might be able to do about it. Also, if you would like to, I would hope to get you out to Phillips in the classroom occasionally for some frank and realistic conversations with students. This is a day for serious reflection about our national purpose. Our students would benefit from your insight.

I will be arriving in Enid next Monday. Our residence will be at 468 N. 19th. I will look forward to getting to know you better. I would like for you to help me familiarize myself with the local power structure and political decision-making process in Enid and environs.

Perhaps you know my father and brother, Waldo and Tal Oden, who have been active for some years in the county organization of the Democratic Party in Jackson County.
