

#### MY STORY: STEWARDSHIP

Lee Galbreath Reflections on Stewardship

What is your family's history with the church? My father is an ordained elder in the Northern Illinois Conference of the UMC and my mother was recently ordained as a deacon. I started attending DMUMC after I moved to Durham a few years ago and I became a member roughly a year ago.

Why do you give to DMUMC?

It's an important part of being an active member. I also think that it is an important part of showing that my faith has a place in my life outside of Sunday morning worship. I have often heard that a budget is a moral document. What would it say about my priorities if I could not find even a small amount to give to the church?

How do you give (monthly check draft, weekly check in the offering plate, a

gift one time per year, etc)?

I pledge a monthly amount but often pay two or three months at a time.

Here are some important dates to remember: Sunday, October 23 - Financial Information Session (12 noon, Soul Café) Sunday, October 30 - Commitment Sunday (Bring your pledge card!)

How can you pray throughout the stewardship campaign?


You can pray, "Lord, increase and strengthen the roots of my faith in you. Show me what I can do to allow you to nourish my roots of faith."
