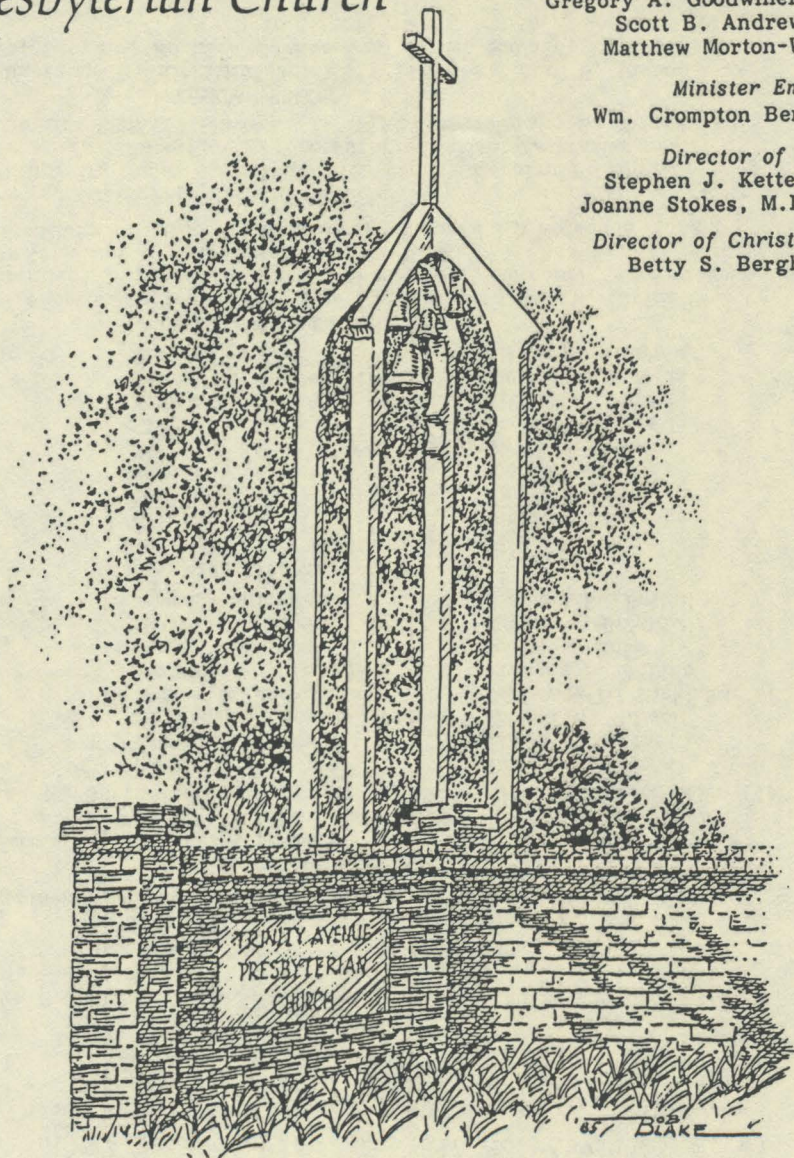

I was very pleased last week when I opened some of the Fire Fund envelopes to find that two of our young grade school students had made a contribution. These children may not know all that is involved in settling matters in the aftermath of a fire, but they do know as members of the church that they have shared in the effort to restore things back to normal again. To date, donations have totaled approximately \$4,800.
