The following Stewardship message was delivered on last Sunday by James R. Elkins, Chairman, Christian Education Committee, at Morning Worship:

"The Stewardship Committee requested that I speak to you on Christian Education and its relationship to the 1990 Budget, but first let me say how proud and pleased the Christian Education Committee is, of you the members of TAPC, who have participated so actively in the programs of the church.

Average attendance in Church School for both youth and adults has grown. We are all proud of the programs that have been developed by Scott, Betty and the youth advisors for our Junior and Senior High Youth, which has resulted in more active youth groups. Also, other very active programs are Primetimers, Children's Church, Vacation Church School, Activities and Fellowship with fun nights, Family Night Suppers, Family Camp, Youth Camp Scholarships, Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts, and I can go on and on. Our increased activity and overall growth in all the Christian Education programs at TAPC, has led the C.E. Committee to see the need for the guidance and expertise of a full-time Director of Christian Education. This will give the educational programs the kind of continuity, planning and quality programs, now, and for the future that we all want for ourselves, our children and those visitors to our church, who we all very much want to join us.
