Following opening prayer by the pastor, minutes of the last meeting were read, and, upon motion, approved.

The treasurer reported that a total of \$4,250.00 had been paid on Conference obligations during the current month. Thanksgiving collections amounted to \$4749.530 and present church balance was \$3,390.04. Mr. Jones stated that the building fund balance amounted to approximately \$3,700.00.

Reporting on recent developments regarding the sale of church property for the purpose of constructing an expressway along Chapel Hill Street, Mr. Jordan stated the Trustees had declined an original offer of the Highway Commission of \$6,900.00 for the two strips of land. He also stated that since since a disposal of the property was not an immediate necessity, the matter would be held in abeyance for the present

Upon motion of Dr. Glasson, seconded by Mr. Jones and carried, the Commission authorized that the required number of fruit baskets be purchased and delivered to the families of retired ministers in accordance with past custom.

In accepting the services of Mr. Fendt, the Chairman suggested that the pastor discuss the matter with proper authorities at Duke University and with the District Superintendent for their official approval so that the Commission would not be guilty of employing an ordained minister without proper action through the Methodist Conference.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was dismissed with prayer by Mr. Holsinger.
