#### Dear Congregation:

Your Bicentennial Celebration Committee has been busy making preparations for the 2016-2017 celebration of Edenton Baptist Church's 200 years of service to our Lord.. We have two projects that are in need of funding by you to help make them happen.

The first is commissioning someone to compose an anthem to commemorate this event. We think it would be a glowing tribute to dedicate this anthem in memory of Mary Sexton Smith for her dedication to Edenton Baptist Church and its music ministry. This anthem would be an ongoing testament to her love for EBC and her faith in God. Our own Michael Morgan has a person in mind that he has worked with before that has performed this task. He estimates that the cost for this anthem would be around \$1500 to \$2000.

Secondly, our own Dr. Jesse Croom has been diligently working on writing the history of Edenton Baptist Church. He has spent numerous hours in research to find facts and stories of our church's importance in the life of Christians across North Carolina and the southeast region. There are costs for the set up and formatting of this book that must be met. The Department of Communication Arts at Chowan University has been working with Dr. Croom to prepare the manuscript for printing. The charges for formatting the manuscript to be ready for the publisher have been estimate at \$1950 to \$2275. None of these costs include printing the book.

If you would like to donate to either or both of these projects, please send your donation to the church office and designate it "Bicentennial Committee". The anthem will be presented during a special service in the celebration. Books will go on sale in November of this year.
