DUKE MEMORIAL METHODIST CHURCH


A meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Duke Memorial Methodist Church was held in the pastor's office, 7:00 P. M., August 4, 1959. The following were present:

Mr, Jordan, chairman, stated that the purpose of this meeting was to consider a request from the Home Security Life Insurance Company to rent one-half of the church's parking lot on a temporary basis. He stated that the Home Security Life Insurance Company would not have sufficient parking space when the S. & W. Cafeteria was opened. He stated that the insurance company had acquired additional land and was in the process of enlarging their parking space. He reminded the Trustees that the Home Security Life Insurance Company had made their parking lot available to members of our church on Sundays.

The matter was discussed at length by various members of the Board following which a motion was made by E. C. Brooks, Jr. that the Board of Trustees recommend to the Official Board of our church that 22 parking spaces on the west side of our parking lot be made available to the Home Security Life Insurance Company during such time as this lot is not needed for church purposes for a period ending December 1, 1959, that the above mentioned parking be regulated by the Home Security people. This motion was seconded by C. N. Hibberd and carried by unanimous vote.

It was the understanding of the Trustees that the church would not charge any rent for the use of our parking lot, but would consider ^{it} a reciprocal courtesy in return for our use of their parking facilities on Sundays. It was also the understanding of the Trustees that the entire parking lot would be reserved for church purposes on the first Monday of each month and such other days as it may be needed for funerals, weddings, etc. A special sign will be placed at the entrance of the parking lot indicating clearly when it is to be reserved for church purposes.
