Hi Richard.

A traditional entrance awning does save significant costs. The previous Fabric Canopy quoted at \$20,000 was for a stylized framework similar to your original design but with a fabric top to save costs. The estimated canopy below will look great and serve the function the church is looking for. However, it does sacrifice some of the great detail work from your original drawing. Whichever way the church should decide to go, both canopies will be of equal quality and integrity.

## Traditional Fabric Entrance Canopy

Materials and labor to fabricate and install a traditional fabric canopy for Duke Memorial Church. The canopy will be attached to the sidewalk using 4" square aluminum posts with plates and drop anchors. There will be a total of fourteen posts, seven per side. The canopy will be the same dimensions as the original canopy proposed (roughly 61-0 feet long by 8-0 feet wide). It will have an 8" valance along the sides and front. The front will be enclosed with fabric (the aluminum detail work could be added as an add-on if desired.) The canopy will be not painted, since the internal structure will be hidden by the fabric. Painting the posts could be added on if desired. The fabric will still be the Sunbrella Firesist HUV for local code requirements. The internal cross support bars will be raised within the structure to maximize the look and area of the canopy.
