

HYMN FOR DECEMBER

"Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence"

No. 148

John Mason Neale and Richard Littledale published in 1868 'The Translation of Primitive Liturgies' and included our hymn for the month of December. This 4 stanza liturgy of St. James is called 'Prayer of the Cherubic Hymn' and is sung in the Eastern Orthodox Church during the celebration of Holy Communion at Easter.

Since 1868, there have been numerous attempts at free paraphrasing this Liturgy, but Gerard Moultrie's version of 1864 remains the popular one and gradually this hymn has found its place in the 'Advent' section of Hymnals for all denominations.

The tune 'Picardy' is a 17th Century French Carol. The Choir has sung an anthem arrangement of this for many years and will not be totally new to you. The Junior and Senior High School Choruses are enjoying using this hymn now, and we hope you too will learn and enjoy it.

Dr. Arch Jacobs says of this hymn "There is no childlike mirth or gaiety here..." whether the tune be sung fast or slow. It must be sung fairly slowly - dignified and ceremonious. If sung fast - it becomes fierce and might even suggest a dance. All tunes change their character to a certain degree with change of speed, but the cleavage here is of a very remarkable nature and denotes an unusual tune.


