

Of all the hymns in our Hymnal, this is one of the most appropriate in view of our times. It IS history driven to its outer limits. We are no longer asking "What are the events now taking place?" but "What is the meaning of these events?"

HYMN FOR OCTOBER

The greatest men of all times have been the spiritual leaders who believed in and visualized a new order emerging out of ruin and chaos by the GRACE OF GOD. These men were convinced that life, not death, had the final word because God transcends history; hence, "We are living, we are dwelling in a grand and awful time." The original meaning of awful is 'awe-ful' and unless we return to the spirit of awe and reverence before the true, the holy, the perfect, the divine, the human race can easily sink to a merely animalistic state. This is a truly great and fitting hymn for these moving days of world crisis and should be sung frequently.

Don't let the physical appearance of this hymn frighten you from trying to learn it. The first, second and fourth lines are identical in tune. The third line (phrase in musical terminology) is different. This old Welsh melody is dignified and flowing. The blending of melody and lyrics is a perfect union.

As the Choir sings this hymn for the Offertory, turn in your hymnals and become acquainted with its lines, as you will be singing "We are living, we are dwelling in a grand and awful time" next week.


