

#### WHAT other qualifications are necessary?

The applicant must presents facts which indicate a NEED for the facilities of The Home.

A reasonably good disposition and the ability to live with others is desirable to assure harmony in The Home.

A Christian character and a previous good church and civic record will be impressive factors.

A satisfactory medical certificate is a basic requirement for approved applicants.

#### HOW are applications selected and approved?

All applications are submitted to the Admissions Committee composed of seven members of the Board of Trustees. Every application is reviewed by this committee and then accepted, deferred or rejected. Applications are judged and evaluated primarily on a basis of need. Church affiliations and records are carefully considered.

### WHAT is the cost of living in the Presbyterian Home?

The current contribution for care and security in The Presbyterian Home is \$175.00 per month. The rate has been fixed by the Board of Trustees and is subject to change by action of the Board of Trustees.

If an applicant is financially able to pay, then he or she is required to pay the cost of care. Ability to pay is *not* a requirement for admission. *NO PRESBYTERIAN* has ever been turned down because he or she could not pay.

#### WHAT care does this contribution include?

The following items would be included in normal care: Lodging; meals, laundry; weekly maid service; the services of the house physician when needed, and the medication which he prescribes; the nursing care in the Infirmary Section and in hospitals available for members of The Home; various programs including religion, social life, and creative projects.

If any member requires hospitalization outside of The Home together with special medication, such services will be provided.

If the member is financially able to reimburse The Home for this service he or she is expected to do so.

In such cases where relatives or friends of members might contribute to the costs of outside medication and hospitalization, an appeal may be made to them. In those cases, where the member has no means to make payment, these services will be provided and paid for from benevolence contributions.

### Why a Mother's Day Offering for the Presbyterian Home?

The Presbyterian Home has been in operation for ten years as of January 1, 1962, and for more than the ten years of operation the Synod of North Carolina has annually approved an offering for The Presbyterian Home to be taken on Mother's Day.

The Mother's Day Offering is used for the operation of the Home and not for the Building Fund.

Of the 111 persons residing in the Home, only 38 are actually paying the full cost of care (\$175.00 per month). This means that there are 74 persons living in the Home who are not paying the full Cost of Care. In this group 25 are the recipients of an Old Age Assistance Grant from the County from which they came.

Mother's Day Offering and the item in the regular Benevolence Budget for the Home are used to pay the difference between what the Members can pay and the actual Cost of Care.

The new Residence Wing and Infirmary will provide an additional 83 rooms, new dining rooms, new kitchens, to-gether with additional office space and other service facilities. When completed the Home will have a capacity for about 190 members.

#### WHAT is the Presbyterian Home, Inc?

A Home for aging persons, primarily "senior citizens" of this area encompassed by the Synod of North Carolina. The Home provides care for elderly persons, who either from loneliness, insecurity or infirmities, find it impractical or burdensome to maintain or establish their own homes.

#### WHO "owns" the home?

The Presbyterian Home was created by a resolution of the Synod of North Carolina in 1945 and is sponsored by that body of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S. Corporate Ownership is vested in The Presbyterian Home, Inc. with Trustees elected by the Synod of North Carolina.

By virtue of your membership in a church of this Synod, you become one of the co-owners.

#### WHO manages the home?

Broad Operating policies are determined by The Board of Trustees—one from each of the nine Presbyteries, six from Synod at large and six from the Women of Synod. Administration of the Home is the direct responsibility of Mr. Richard A. Short, Executive Director, and his staff.

#### WHO is eligible to make application?

An applicant must have passed his 65th anniversary before action will be taken on an application. There is no maximum age limit.

Presbyterians from the Synod of North Carolina will be given first consideration.

Applicants should be ambulatory when entering The Home.
