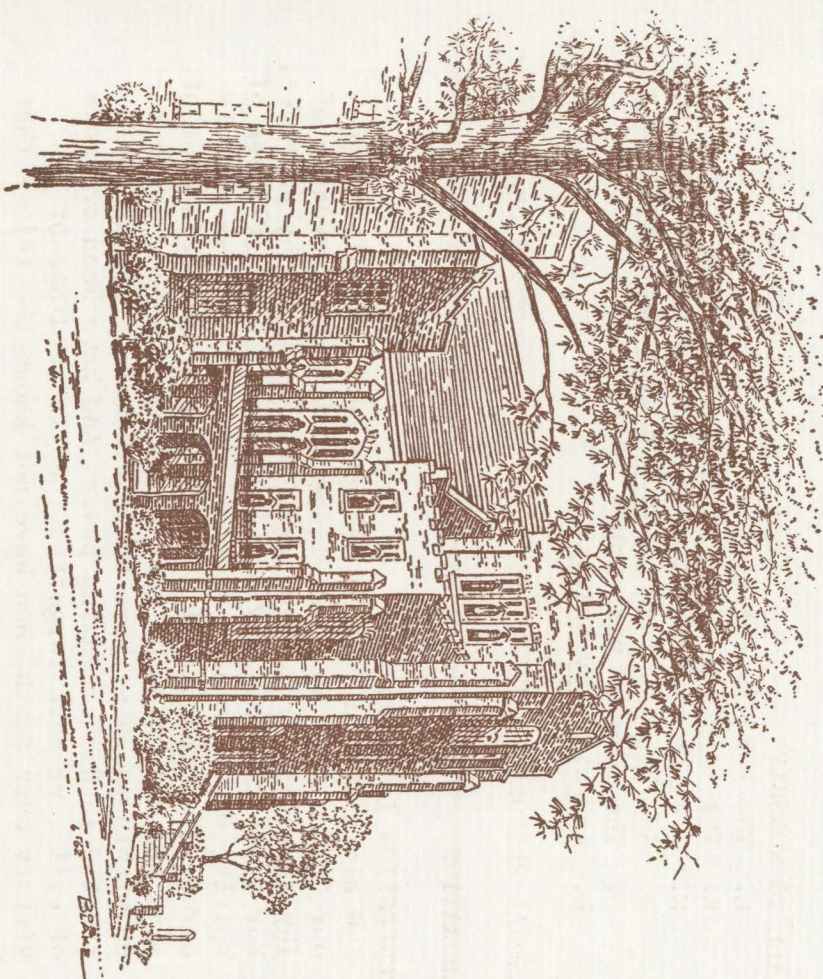

From the Sunday School Superintendent:

We have now been back in our completely renovated Sunday School or Church School Education building about eight months. Unfortunately during the months which we were so disrupted, we lost some of our members and have not regained them. We also have a number of Church members who do not attend Church school. It is our desire to have every member of every family attending. The Adult classes have several types of lessons, one of which should appeal to everyone. The George Watts-Men's Class, the Hallie Pope Ladies Class, and the George Mathis "couples and singles" class use the Uniform Lesson with several teachers rotating each week. In addition, there is the Covenant Life "Couples and Singles" class which is a discus-

sion type class using the Covenant Life Curriculum material. Come and try out one of these, if it is not exactly what you are looking for, don't hesitate to change and try out a different one. We think some have tried a class at times and because it was not exactly what they were looking for, they did not return to try out a different one. Come and try them all until you have found the one that best suits you!

For our children, we have classes from the crib through high school with a staff of very capable teachers. We urge you to BRING the children...don't SEND them.

It is time to make plans for teachers for the Fall. We like to have a teacher serve two years and then have someone else take over. This way, all that would like to, can help with the teaching without feeling that they are accepting a "life time job". There are excellent summer conferences at Montreat, designed specifically for individual classes. If a person knows now that they will be teaching a certain class in the Fall, vacations can be planned and the whole family can go to Montreat to take advantage of these conferences. Activities are planned that will interest all members of your family. Whether you are sure you will teach this fall or not, go ahead and make plans to go to Montreat. If you don't use it right away, it will be helpful later...and your family will thoroughly enjoy the week.

If we can be of help Sunday morning in choosing or locating a class, the Treasurer and Superintendent's office is located in the front of the Education building on the first floor. For help during the week on information about Montreat, contact the Church office.
