AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

7 . 24

A Creed in the Words of St. John

Minister: Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is the one true Church, apostolic and universal, whose holy faith let us now declare:

Minister and People: We believe that God is Spirit, and they that worship him must worship him in spirit and in truth.

We believe that God is Light, and that if we walk in the light, we have fellowship one with another.

We believe that God is Love, and that everyone that loveth is born of God and knoweth God.

We believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son.

We believe that he is the Resurrection and the Life, and that whosoever believeth on him, though he were dead, yet shall he live.

We believe that we are children of God, and that he hath given us of his Spirit.

We believe that if we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all uncleanness.

We believe that the world passeth away and the lust thereof, but he that doeth the will of God abideth forever. Amen. Study the Chrismons on display in the Narthex. Those today are:

1) CHI RHO W/ALPHA AND OMEGA

The most widely-known Chrismon is this combination of the first two letters of the Greek word, <u>CHRISTOS</u> (XPISTOS), or, Christ. The Chi Rho (XP) is the oldest monogram for Christ and was commonly used by the early Church. (For many, in that day, the shame and death of the cross was too immediate for them to use it openly.) Sometimes, people say, "Let's take the X out of Christmas!" X meant the Christ over 1,000 years before the English language began to develop.

2) SUN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

"But for you who fear my name, the Sun of Righteousness shall arise with healing in his wings." Malachi 4:2

3) LATIN CROSS WITH XP, TRIANGLE, ROSES, AND M. When you look at this Chrismon, you can see the XP in the form of the cross used. The triangle symbolizes the Holy Trinity and points to our Lord's divine nature while the M, the monogram of His Mother, Mary, suggests His human birth.

The rose decoration of the M further emphasizes the fact of the Christ's birth as One of us. Use of the shells to cover the triangle evokes another idea, that of our own birth. Shells traditionally symbolize Holy Baptism. Thus, they remind us of our second birth, our spiritual rebirth in Christ at baptism when, by faith, we become sons of God.
