HYMN FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

"Praise God, Ye Servants of the Lord"

Hymnbook, No. 19

William B. Bradbury took this paraphrase of the 113th Psalm from the 1912 Psalter and set it to a tune known as "Andre."

All singing Christians owe Mr. Bradbury a debt of gratitude for bringing to light and practical use a multitude of hymns during the 19th century. He was prolific in composing, paraphrasing and arranging texts to known and unknown tunes. We are told that over 2,000,00 copies of his books and hymn settings have been sold.

This particular hymn is quite easy to learn and sing and should eventually take its place with our other well known praise hymns.

The choir will introduce the new hymn this morning for the offertory. Turn in your hymnbook and follow.

CHRISMONS

Those on display in the Narthex today are:

1) Jerusalem Cross

A symbol of the crusades, this cross appeared on the shield of the Crusader Kings of Jerusalem. Some suggest the five crosses symbolize the five wounds of our Lord. Another interpretation: The four Tau crosses which make up the center cross represent the Old Testament prophecies of a Savior. When the prophecies culminated on a hill outside Jerusalem, our salvation was accomplished. The four small crosses represent those who take up a cross, follow Him, and proclaim and live the gospel in the four corners of the world. Thus, the history of Christianity - prophecy, full-fill-ment, and acceptance throughout the world.

2) Stylized Fish

Early Christians used the fish widely as an easily made and recognized secret sign. During the times of the persecution of the early Church, Christians could find one another by using this simple password. To the outsider, the fish was a mere decoration; to the Christian, it held deep significance. Centuries later, in 1963, a newstory reported that Cuban Christians, when they found themselves in a situation similar to that faced by the first Christians, revived the use of this emblem.

ICHTHUS (IXOYC), the Greek word for fish forms an acrostic on the Greek phrase, Jesus (I) Christ (X), God's (0) Son (Y), Savior (C).

3) Cross Triumphant or Cross of Victory

A cross supreme over the world shich is represented by a ball. The divisions suggest continents which are united into one by the circular extension of the cross. Thus - the world united in Christ who has dominion over all.
