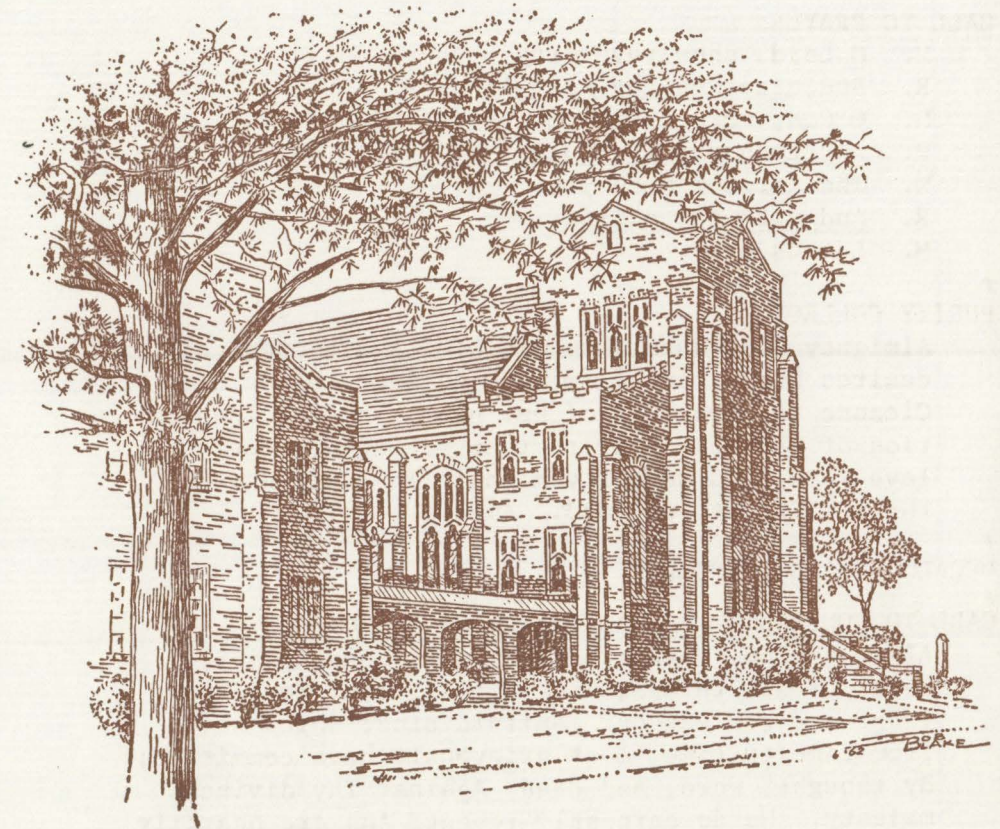

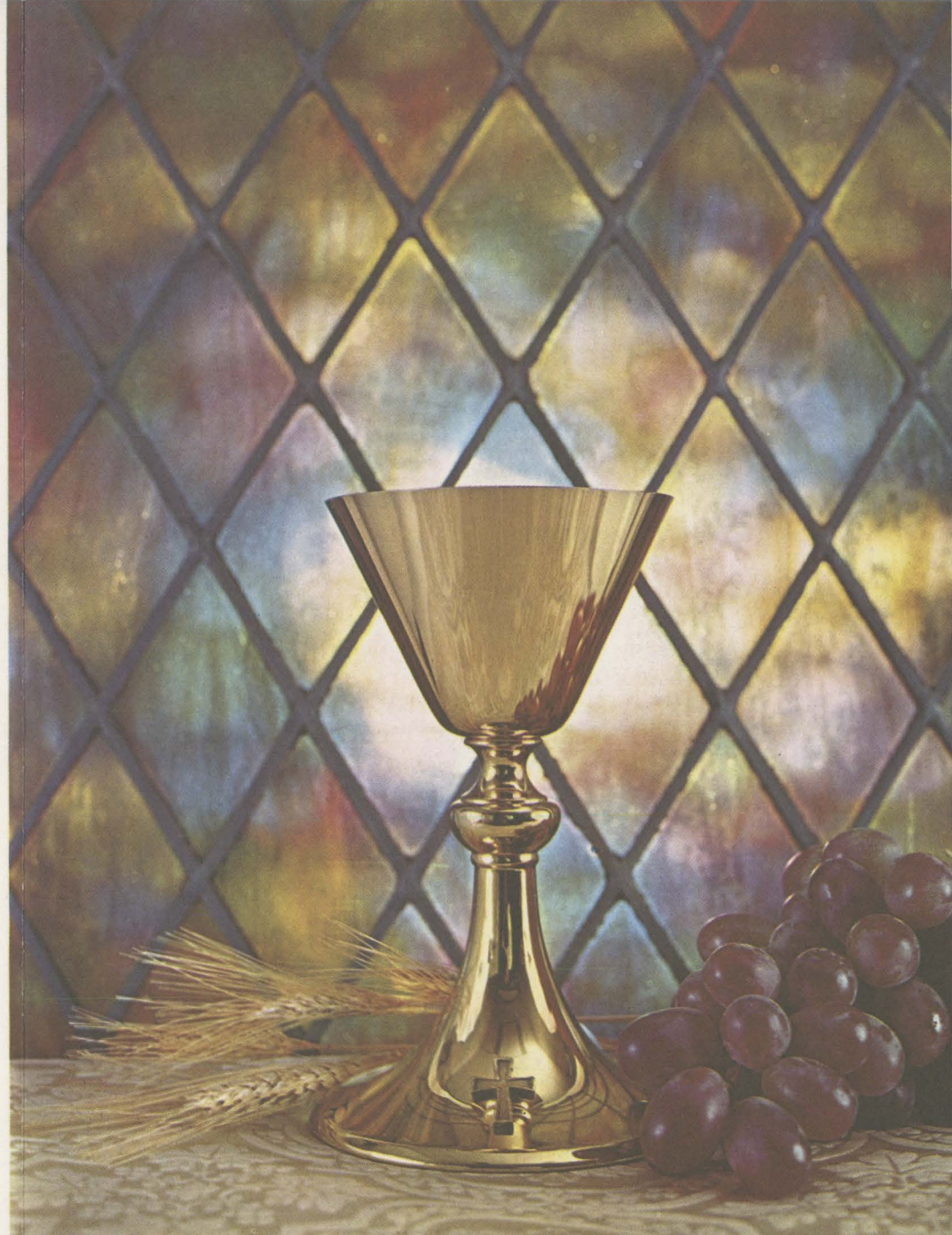

CHRISMONS

STUDY THE CHRISMONS ON DISPLAY IN THE NARTHEX.
The ones today are

(1) *Three Entwined Circles.* A symbol for the Holy Trinity. The circle symbolizes eternity, God who is the only eternal One, or eternal life with God in His kingdom.

(2) *IOTA ETA SIGMA (IHS) on GREEK CROSS.*

The first three letters of JESUS in Greek constitute this familiar monogram. The Sigma can be written as S, C, or E. The Greek long E, Eta, looks like our "N", with a tail, η . In Greek, a bar over letters denotes an abbreviation. At times, early Christians extended the Eta up to the bar to convert it to a cross. This often made a cross topped Eta look like the Latin H. Thus, the Eta was confused with the H. During the dark ages, people forgot the symbol was of Greek letters and lost its original meaning. To fill the gap, interpretations based on words in various languages developed. They are not wrong, but they are not historically accurate and do not coincide with the originator's intent.

All extensions of the Greek Cross are equal in length - was much used by early Greek artists.

(3) *Sun of Righteousness.* Malachi 4:2.

"But for you who fear my name, the Sun of Righteousness shall arise with healing in his wings."
