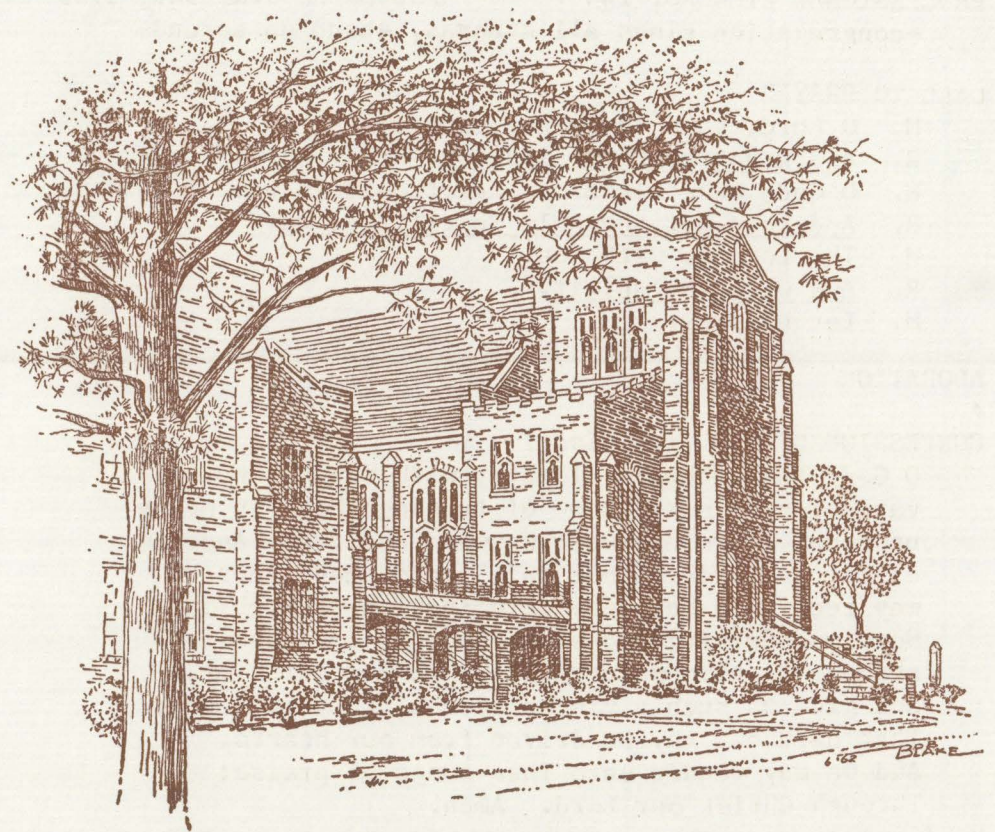

CHRISMONS

STUDY THE CHRISMONS ON DISPLAY IN THE MARTHEX.

The ones today are:

CIRCLE WITH MONOGRAMS

- (1) The circle, which is endless, symbolizes eternity. By extension, it can also symbolize God, the only Eternal One, or the eternal life we may have with Him. The cross turned to an X symbolizes the manger and another circle symbolizes the Christ Child. The rose symbolizes the Nativity of our Lord, also our Lord's human mother. Many meanings other than nativity can be seen in this Chrismon - death on the cross as a means to eternal life. This one asks you to read it for yourself.

LATIN CROSS, WITH CHI RHO, TRIANGLE, ROSES AND M.

- (2) The Chi Rho forms the cross. The triangle symbolizes the Holy Trinity and points to our Lord's divine nature while the M, the monogram of His Mother, Mary, suggests his human birth. The rose for Nativity and for the human mother is again used. Our own birth is brought in to this chrismon by the use of the shell which traditionally symbolizes Holy Baptism; thus they remind us of our second birth, our spiritual rebirth in Christ at baptism when, by faith, we become sons of God. See Galatians 3:23.

IOTA AND CHI WOVEN THROUGH TWO CIRCLES

- (3) An ancient design that suggests the Christ, who died on the Cross at a specific time in history (the outer circle represents the finite) nevertheless provided, by means of that death, the eternal answer (the inner circle, the infinite) that goes beyond life into Eternity.
