STUDY THE QUESTIONS ON PAGE 10 IN THE BIBLE.

The cross says:

- (1) Christ with humanity, God, and other symbols. The cross symbolizes Christ, the Father, the resurrection, the cross the death of Christ, and the life of Christ.
- (2) Greek Cross with Christ, NIKAI (Greek for Victory) as the rays of a star and behind the cross. This is a symbol of the Cross in Christ symbolizes our Lord's victory over the sin and death of the world.
- (3) Cross and Christ (X), the first letter of Christ, combined with the cross. The Christ and the Cross cannot be separated. Only when we understand them together do we understand the full meaning of God's love.

- (1) *Circle with Monograms, Crosses, and Other Symbols.*
The circle symbolizes eternity, the butterfly the resurrection, the cross the death of Christ, and the Chi his presence.
- (2) *Greek Cross with Crowns.* NIKA (Greek for Conquer) as the rays of a rising sun behind the cross. This adaptation of the Cross in Glory symbolizes our Lord's victory over the sin and death of the world.
- (3) *Cross and Chi.* (X), the first letter of Christ, combines with the cross. The Christ and the Cross cannot be separated. Only when we understand them together do we understand the full measure of God's love.
