## RET. REUBEN H. MOFFETT.

Bro. Moffett was born in the town of Brimfield, Mass., July 21, 1797, and died October 17,1863 . When about two years old, his parents removed to New York. In $183 t$, he came to Illinois, and settled in the vicinity of Bayley's Point, now Tonica.

Bro. Moffett's parents were Baptists, and, as he informed us, gave faithful attention to the religious training of their children. We are not informed at what age Bro. M. experienced religion, but it must have been in his early manhood. At first he united with the M. P. Church; but on removing to this state, there being no organization of that body here at that time, he joined the M. E. Church.

Bro. Moffett was exercised about preaching the gospel soon after his conversion, but from an overwhelming sense of unfitness for the sacred calling, he hesitated fearing to go forward and not daring to make up his mind that he would not preach. In this state of suspense he was found by the late Rev. John Sinclair, to whom he unburdened his mind. Under the judicious connsel of the sainted man of God, Bro. M. was led to give himself to the work of the ministry.

In 1837, he was admitted on trial in the Illinois Conference, and appointed to Vermillion Nission, Peoria District; in 1838, to Washington, Peoria District; in 1839, Athens, Bloomington District; in 1840 and 1841, to Washington, Bloomington District; in 1842, to Mt. Vernon, Mt. Vernon District; in 18t3, to Wauponset, Bloomington District. In 1844, by dirision of the conference, he became a member of Rock River Conference, and his name is returned on the Minutes "located," which we think is a mistake; for in frequent conversations, he never mentioned having located, and his wife told us that she mas quite sure he nerer was located.

In 1845 and 1846 , he traveled Iroquois Circuit, Washington District. He was superannuated in 1847, 1848 and 1849. In 1850, he was made effective, and appointed to Farmington Circuit, Peoria District. In 1851, he was appointed to Chillicothe Circuit, Peoria District; but early in the year his health failed, and at the next session of the Conference, held in St. Charles, in 1852, he receired a superannuated relation, which he continued to receive annually until his death.

Bro. Moflett, when he joined the traveling connection, had a remarkably strong physical constitution; but while laboring on Iroquois Circuit, in 1846, he had an attack of "milch sickness," from the effects of which he nerer fully recorered. 'To those unacquainted with him he had the appearance of robust health, yet it required but very little exertion of any kind to prostrate him.

IIe possessed a good mind, and having the adrantage of carly culture was capa ble of taking respectable rank in the ministry anywhere. He was a man genuine courage. When satisfied of the righteousness of an object, he wr pursue it at any hazard. He would rebuke sin fearlessly, and as an administr" of discipline he endeavored to "keep the rules, not mend them."

As a friend, Bro. Moffett was strongly attached and deroted. As a Chri he kept the faith. He was prepared to die, and often spoke of his rearlin depart. Although his death was sudden and very distressing in many of ; cumstances, yet we all feel that it is well with him.

He willed one third of his very considerable property-real and persona the Foreign Missionary Society. He left a wife and two daughters, who m in hope.

## To the Honorable Senators and Incpresentatives of the General Assembly of the Stare nf Illuguix:

Your petitioners represent that, whereas the statute, in chapter thirty, section one lumdred and forty-seven, division cleven, for the punishment of "of ofices against the Public Morality," de, in such cases made anl provided, is inoperative in regard in a large class of offenders, from the fact that the said statute makes no proviston for the aprisomment of the offender, in case he, she, or they have no property out of which ollicer can makesuch fine: Therefore, we, your petitioners, most respectfully, but estly request your honorable body to make such amendments to the said statute as in your wisdom may deem necessary to secure the protection, peace and harmony bbath sehools, as well as "congregation or collection of citizens assembled togeththe purpose of worshiping . Imighty God."

## 3. ON INCREASE OF SALARY.

## A Memnrial of the Members of the Gentral Illinnis Annual Conference to the Friends, and Mimbers of the Church southin the bourds of said Conference:

We, the members of the Central Illinois Anmual Conference of the M. E. Church in Conference assembled, to the members and friends of the Chureh, greeting:-

In riew of the important interests involved we wonld beg leave to lay before you the subject of ministerial support for the ensuing Conference year.

Before this article meets your eye, about one hundred and fifty preachers connected with this body will have been assigned to their sexeral fields of labor. They come to minister to you in spiritual things. They come looking to you-dependent upon you for an adequate support. Thus it is ordained of God, "They that preach the gospel shall live by the gospel."

You will not think it strange then, dear brethren and friends, even with multiplied and precious remembrances of your abonnding liberality in the history of the past, that we should now feel a deep solicitude with reference to the immediate future; nor does this anxiety result from even the remotest apprehension of our semvices being by you underrated, any more than it implies deterioration on your part. We feel that we have nothing to fear on these grounds. But we do believe that it would be quite unreasonabic for us to expect of you, in these times of commercial disturbance, a mature understanding of the complications of ecclesiastical finance, especially while your minds are necessarily pre-occupied with business responsibilities peculiar to your own position.
Hence we deem it due to you, as well as to them who labor in love among you, that we should present a concise statement of facts pertinent to the subject, which facts may serve in some measure to guide you in your deliberations when you come to fix the salaries of your preachers, while the history of this generation affords no parallel to the extravagant prices which now rule, as one of the legitimate results of the terrible war which has so deranged our emrrency and distracted our commerce.

We would accordingly submit for your consideration the advance of groceries and dry goods, which we average at 300 per cent., and the further advance of all farm products, which we may fairly put at 400 per cent., the great staple commodity, corn, having advanced even 700 per cent.

Now we grant that on dry goods and groceries the people, as well as the preacher, are committed to pay the adrance. But while this is true of the people, we aver that the farmer and the mechanic suffer no pecuniary disadvantage therefrom. The advance in the price of labor brings the mechanic up to a level with the times. He pays the farmer $\$ 10$ per barrel for Hour which four years ago he bought for $\$ 5$, and he pars for it by turning out to the farmer a wagou at $\$ 150$, which flour at $\$ 5$ instead of $\$ 10$ would have procured for $\$ 75$ instead of $\$ 150$.
The farmer pays 33 cents per pound for sugar which previous to the war cost 8 and 10 cents. He pars 60 cents for coffiee instead of 15 . He pays 50 cents for cotton goods instead of $12 \frac{1}{2}$, $\delta \cdot$. That is, he pays, just as the preacher does, say on an arerare, four times the former price of these articles. But how does he pay for them? Tre answer, he sells corn at $\$ 1.00$ which he then sold at $12 \frac{1}{2}$ eents. In other words, the farner now receives 3 pounds of sugar in eachange for one bnshel of corn, instead of $1 \stackrel{1}{2}$ pounds as formerly. He receives two yards of cotton for one bushel of corn, instead of one at the beginning of the rebellion. He now receives $1 \frac{1}{2}$ pounds of coffec for one bushel of corn, whereas, four years ago he gave $1 \frac{1}{4}$ bushels of corn for one pound of coffee. All this, you will see, brethren, tends to the building up, instead of the impairino of the circumstances of the farmer. We have illustrated by naming a single commo* ity. We might extend the application to alnost every standard article upon whit our industrious yeomanry rely for a competence and for prosperity.

We now turn to the mercantile fraternity. It will here be seen at once th. high ruling prices are favorable, rather than otherwise, to their pursuits. Thew mate their profits by a per centum adrance on the cash caluation of what they $t$ trade, without any particular reference to prices current.

From this view of the suljeet it is clear that the iuterests of the farmer, the chant and the mechanic are quite similarly affected by the price's of the thmes; a is well known that the learned professions have advanced their fees in the same in
But, we ask you, dear brethren, where is the itinerant, who, by his position, is ne sarily cut off from almost every resouree, and is not a party authorized to detern
what is requisite that he may escape destitution, not even to think of providing for the future, or sharing with those who, a a ailing themselves of the times, are making large accumulations of property.

Dear brethren, look but for a moment, and you will see that the itinerant is not only deprived of the benefits aceruing to thousands by virtue of the superabundance of curreney, but he stands betreen tro fives He must pay the farmer's advance on the one hand, and the merehant's on the other; thus suffering all the disalvantages resulting from high prices with not even one adrantage on his side. The itinerant alone is deprived of the power of placing upon his time and his services the raluation which would be eommensurate with the demands of the times.

How many anong our dear brethren even noted for liberality would, without investigation, see the consistency of estimating now $\$ 1,2(1)$ where they estimated but $\delta(1 n)$ four years ago? or $\Sigma_{0} 2,010$ instead of \$in) then? And yet this would be onlr in ratio with the 300 per cent. adrance on such articles as enter into family consumption.

Bear with us, then, dear friends, while we urge upon you by every consideration of dnty, consistency and justice, that yon suffer not our Zion to lanquish, onr altars to be dishonored, our religion to be reproached and our God offended hy withholding from his cause while the angel of prosperity, smiling, guards and governs every interest connected with your farms, your shops and your stores. So may your souls he blest and your learts and minds be kept in the knowledge and love of Goul.

3 Fatmeis and Brethren:-Your Committee on Ellucation would respectfully reat we learn from the representatires of the institutions under the cupervision of suference that they are all prospering, notwithstanding the disturbed condition of country, in all the usual facilities for imparting an academical and collegiate ation.
Id debts are in process of liquidation, libraries and cabinets enlarged, and the num. of teachers and their compensation somewhat inereased We therefore recomsnd the adoption of the following report:

## illinols wesleyan cxiyersity.

Tour committee take pleasure in reporting the suceess and growth of the Illinois Wesleyan University in all the essential elements of strength. The debt of the Unirersity amounting to $\$ 4,951.81$ has been paid, leaving no liability, except a small amount for current expenses. There is $\$ 550$ still due the teachers on salary, but the funds on hand are sufficient to meet the claim. The attendance of stadents has been and is steadily increasing. The whole number in all departments last year was 181, including the model school. The term just opened bids fair to show a large inerease over last year. Indeed, there are more already enrolled than ever before at the same date in the term. The facilities for instruction are keeping pace with the demands of the institution. Another member has been added to the Faeulty this year, and the additions made to the library and museum by the efforts of the President, especially at the Smithsonian Institute at Washington, have been raluable and gratifring. The healthy growth of the Luiversity imperiousl $\zeta$ demands increased effort on the part of its friends to supply its necessities. The anount paid for salaries to the teachers is inadequate to their support.

The buildings of the University, though good, do not afford sufficient room for its increasing wants. What steps in adrance shall be taken to secure the desired means, and how we may meet the responsibilities that are thus thrown upon us in the providence of God, require our earnest and prayerful deliberation. We pledge ourselves to give to our Cuiversity our hearty support and best counsel at this state of its history, When the institution promises more fruits to the Conference than ever before. We recommend the re-election to the office of Trustees O. T. Reeres, L. B. Kent, J. G. Evans and Wm. Smith, whose term of office expires at this time; also, the reappointment of Rev. O. S. Munsell, D. D., as President, and Rer. C. C. Knowlton, A. M., as Professor in the institution; also, as risitors from this Conference W. C. Knapp, Richard IIaner, J. B. Craig, P. A. Crist, G. M. Irwin and J. E. Rutledge.

## HEDDING SEMINARE.

The reports from this institution are encouraging in regard to its relief from its former financial embarrassments, and also in regard to its suceess in the number of its students during the past year; therefore

## 10. ON STATE OF THE COUNTRY.

When a nation, threatened by either foreign foes, or domestic traitors, is struggling for existence, and when reckless men, grown insoient by indulgence, falter at no frandulence that may weaken the power of the govermment and encourage rebels to more
vigorous efforts to destroy the nation, it becomes the duty of all loyal citizens to cherish unwavering allegiance to the govermment, and to render it all the support in their power.

As Chistian Ministers we diselaim all desire to interfere with questions purely politi-eal,-bound, however, by our religious creed to nllegiance to the govermment, and, interested in common with other citizens in the permanence of our institutions, we chaim it to be our right-our duty-to give respectful, hut plain and unequivocal expression to opinions we entertain, matured by prayerful investigation, upon questions now agitating the public mind; therefore,

1. Resolved, That we regard the executive officer of the government, ehosen according to due forms of law, as "the minister of God," entitled to reverence and obedience for "conscience sake."
2. Resolvel, That in preserving the nation from destruetion, the Executive is fully justified in the use of every means rendered necessary by the exigenees of the oceasion.
3. Resolved, That, among the measures adopted by the government for the maintenance of the Federal Union, we regard the proclanation giving liberty to the slaves in states in rebellion against the goverment, as eminently wise and patriotic; and, though necessity alone conferred the right on the Executive, a department of the govermment of greatly restricted powers, yet the exercise of that right was enjoired by the authority of the Supreme Ruler of the Universe; "Let the oppressed go free," "Prochaim liberty throughout the land, to all the inhabitants thereof," are injunctions, the neglect of which has brought upon us all the calamities we suffer as a nation.
4. lesolved, That though men of peace-ministers of the gospel of peace-shoekel at the effusion of blood, pained with the eries of the widow and fatherless, keenly alive to all the horrors of internecine war-our sons are in the army-thousands of the members of our communion are there-many of them the fruits of our own labor, yet we earnestly, and solemmly protest against any adjustment of our present difficulties, that does not include submission to federal authority, freedom to the whole population, and the vindication of the insulted flag of the nation, by the infliction of exemplary penalties on the guilty leaders in their atmeious rebellion.
5. Resolved, That we regard the elamor of professional politicians for an armistice and for a compromise with rebels in armas, as the deceptive utterances of unprincipled men, whose inordinate ambition for office incapacitates them for appreciating the dignity of a government capable of vindieating its honor and protecting its subjects.
6. Resolved, That the patience, the bravery, and the magnanimity of our men in the army, sheds an unfading luster on the American arms-that we pledge to them our warinest sympathy and unfaltering support, and that with fratemal joy we will welcome their return from the field of conguest, when the war is ended, and cherish the memory of the heroic dead as the martys of liberty.
7. Resolvel, That we regard the Sanitary and Chistian Commissions as twin sisters of celestial birth, who, by administering alleriations to the sick and wounded, have saved the lives of thousands of brave men-mitigated the sufferings of the dying, and cheered with immortal hope the departing spirit, as it plumed its wings for its upwarl flight. We pledge to them contributions to the full measure of our ability and the exercise of our social and ministerial influence.
8. Resolvel, That the patience with which the colored man has endured the oppression of four generations, the forbearance he has exercised toward the guilty oppressor when providentially placed in circmastances to avenge his wrongs; the readiness with which he has sheltered, and fed, and directed our soldiers escaping from Sonthern prisons pursued by blood-hounds, and hy men more fiecee and cruel tham they; the promptness with which, when permitted, he rallies around our flag, and the bravery with which he sustains it in the fierceness of batte-strife, have pmrehased for him a claim indisputable to all the immunities of an American citizen.
9. Resoled, That we recognize, with devout thankfulness, the Divine favor so signally manifest in the success He has given our armies in resening from the tratorous power the larger portion of the territory of which it intended to rob us, and in the enconraging indications that promise a speedy termination of the war; and that we will not cease to pray that the nation, humbled and forgiven, may come out of its fiery trial, purified, and fitted for usefuhess among the nations of the earth
